Preface


This is the India of my dreams...

Wake-Up to Dream!

Bal Sanskar Kendras

Children of Bal Sanskaar Kendras are taught all academic subjects namely English, Gujarati, Hindi, Mathematics, Science and Environment with the help of TLM material created by Jeevantirth. This material is designed in such a way that it holds the interest and attention of the kids while imbibing them with knowledge. A total of 450 children receive education through 15 Bal Sanskaar Kendras.

All the students and teachers actively participate in, and celebrate, each festival throughout the year. This they do by indulging in art and craft activities; during the year they created kites, hats and bags out of paper, photo frames using ice-cream sticks, painted diyas, greeting cards, rakhies and various things for their own consumption. This year the Christmas celebration was the event for the year and month long preparation of making drama, action songs, dance performances were greatly applauded by the pack jammed audience in the Ambedkar open air theatre.

In order to provide the children with a holistic education we take them on educational tours, movies, government establishments like police stations, etc. from time to time. They also paid a visit to Vatsalya Vrudhdh Ashram old-age home situated at Vadaj, Ahmedabad, where they spend the day, dancing and singing, with the senior citizens. It was a heartfelt event for all of us. This year kids enjoyed their annual educational tour to Sardar Sarovar Dam and Nilkanth Dhaam Swaminarayan Temple.

One of the pillars of a child's

ground work is

his/her parents. Therefore we consider it indispensable to involve the children's guardian in the educational process.

Parents Visit and Meetings:

Every month Bal Mitras from each center go for the parents visit in their respective areas. They go house to house, at least 20 to 30 houses each month. It is observed that 80% of all the parents respond positively to our Bal Mitras. During these individual meetings the Bal Mitras and parents reflect upon the progress of each child. There were quarterly parent's meeting in all the Bal Sanskar Kendras.





As a mark of respect and to recognise teachers' contribution towards the society, most countries celebrate Teachers' Day. In India, we observe it on September 5, the day teacher and President Dr Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan was born. We at Jeevantirth celebrate with full vigour. About 50 plus children became teachers of the day and taught difficult lessons to the children with their own understanding and methodology using TLMs!

There are some individuals like Deepti Shah who are proactive and give support as an when required to our Bal Sanskar Kendras. When Deepti Shah visited Jeevantirth, she felt that writing desks should be provided to the students and she took it upon herself and donated the same. She also motivated Yuva Unstoppable to donate sports equipments and other things for our BSKs. Children are making best use of them!





Case Study

Jaydeep (Std 5, Valmiki RushiNi Chali) has been attending BSK since 3 years now. He was a shy student suffering from inferiority complex, reluctant to talk to his classmates or participate in any group activities, competitions or cultural programs. His reading skills in Gujarati and knowledge of mathematics were considerably weak.

After being involved with us he no longer feels inferior. He has gained fluency in reading Gujarati and writes beautifully as well. His classmates enjoy listening to him when he narrates stories in front of the whole class. He has developed a better understanding of mathematics too; he can now solve questions regarding division, multiplication, addition and subtraction. During a recent cultural festival he addressed a crowd of 500 students and gave a speech on addictions.

Girl-Child Education Program

Girl Child Education is a program undertaken by Jeevantirth to enhance wholly growth of a girl child – intellectual growth, physical growth, social growth, mental growth, educational growth and vocational growth. We learn about the girls' interests through various interactive activities; they display interests like dancing, singing, painting, pot decoration, mahendi art, tailoring, saloon work, computer, etc. Following which they develop skills like cooking, tailoring and saloon work. Five batches of GCE classes are held regularly, Monday to Friday; 58 girls attend each GCE class daily.

GCE continued its work with 79 aanganvadis of Ahmedabad till July, 2016, the caretakers whereof where given training once a month by Jeevantirth staff. Due to strikes held by aanganvadi workers we faced difficulties in conducting classes. We have established a close relationship with the children of these aanganvadis, as a result of the strikes we were unable to be in touch with them. Consequently we organized classes to be held outside aanganvadis, in schools of respective slums, so the children would not be exempt of the necessary education.

Learning at GCE:

Girls are taught academic subjects like English, Mathematics, Science, etc. in an informal way through activities like card games, songs, poems and various other TLMs developed by Jeevantirth. We don't follow any curriculum but give need based education more related to their daily life. Girls also visit our small library to quench their bubbling curiosity; moreover they learn to apply these teachings in their daily lives. We use their daily life experiences like kitchen activities to explain them principals of physics. Girls get firsthand experience of flora and fauna at The Serenity Library and Botanical Garden wherein they partake in nature trail and learn about butterfly lifecycle, herbal garden, etc.

Puberty is a decisive stage in forming a girl's mindset about various facets of herself and the society; girls feel free to share their queries which liberate them from their personal confusions and miss-apprehensions.

Value Education Program


About the Program:

Jeevantirth in high spirits is running this program in partnership with Naraindas Morbhai Budhrani Trust. It has been almost 4 years now! While formal education emphasizes more on intellectual development, value education is an endeavour to develop the moral conscience of the child, inculcate values and right attitude towards life.

Target Group: Standard VI, VII and VIII.

During this initial period of adolescence, a child undergoes several distinct and unique changes: biological, cognitive and socio-emotional. Hence, they are to be guided properly so that they become aware of how to adapt themselves to these changes and respond in an appropriate manner.

Module: Rapport establishment with the students is the first priority so that they give up all their inhibitions and take active participation in various exercises.

Training: A three days' training workshop on Peace was conducted by a team of Gandhi Peace Foundation at Juna Koba, from 7th to 9th February, 2017.

Achievements: When parents and teachers appreciate the efforts of our Value Educators / Facilitators and acknowledge the impact they make in the children, it is indeed the highest achievement of this program. Another significant incident is that these students have mobilized enough resources and bought stationary items for the under privileged children and distributed the same during Deepawali.

Case Study

Mahek of Sadhu Vaswani School used to be very quiet and sensitive girl. She would neither reply nor ask any questions in class thinking what if it is incorrect and the class will burst out laughing as it normally happens. Moreover, she also felt that the Class Monitor was biased towards her and it made her more inferior. She did not even share any of these feelings to her parents. Our facilitator, Mitesh Macwan, observed Mahek and gradually began to interact with her during the sessions so that she speaks. Then she was personally called and counselled. The very fact that she was attended by the facilitator developed in her the confidence to stand for herself. She felt important and so motivated that she is now willing to participate in upcoming events of her school. She no more feels hesitation to initiate a conversation and make friends. Our Thoughts and Values ultimately define who we are..!



Nature Education Program

It is a joint initiative of Serenity Trust and Jeevantirth, launched in the year 2013 for the underprivileged children of Ramapirno Tekro and nearby slums with the aim to make the children sensitive towards Nature. The program is designed in a manner which is more about experiencing the surrounding through our senses.

Introduction to Serenity Library and Botanical Garden:

Founded by Mr. Firdos Cambatta, it is located on Bhat-Koteshwar Road, Ahmedabad, spreading its greenery over 40,000 sq. meters with more than 800 species of indigenous and exotic plants, a botanical garden and two excavated water bodies. Naturally, it has now become an abode of a variety of butterflies and birds. There is also a small library in its premise. It has about 3,000 books on environment, wildlife and conservation.

Nature Education Module:

The whole concept is explained through Nature Trail which includes a number of activities and games as well.

Achievement: Total 114 visits were made by more than 5,500 children from 65 different schools!

From next year, it is proposed to conduct night camps as well for the under privileged children to bring them more close to nature.

Self-Help Groups

About the Program:

Jeevantirth, committed to work for the vulnerable sections of the society, realized the hardships that a woman in the slum encounters in her day to day life and hence, took up the challenge of empowering the women of Ramapirno Tekro through formation of Mahila Bachat Mandal. It began its functioning in a full-fledged manner since July, 2011, with the appointment of a full time Program Coordinator, Minaxi Dhairav. The Committee stand dissolved and is reconstituted biennially. It was a consensus decision of the members to contribute Rs. 100 per month in the initial 2 years which was later enhanced to Rs. 200 per month in the year 2013. As the saying goes 'Hard work pays off' Mahila Bachat Mandal is now a committee of 32 different groups and still counting!

Until now we restricted the membership of SHG members to 500, but looking to the demand from the community we are taking it to 1,000 and we have made a plan to strengthen SHG activities in the future.





On 10th Decemeber, 2016 we inaugurated 'Aapni Dukaan' which translates to 'Our Store'. It is a store of, by and for the women. Its aim is to make available all the household necessities to the women of Ramapir no Tekro for 365 days a year. Until now we held camps every 2 to 3 months during which women of SHGs were provided with their needs. Having to provide for a large number of households enables us to purchase quality goods at wholesale rate; this cuts out the middle man and provides goods cheaper than the market rate. Moreover Aapni Dukaan will provide these goods at easy installments to the needy. The income generated by this venture will be used to further help SHGs, making them self-dependent.

It is a step forward for the slum folks towards freedom. We hope that the road keeps unfolding as it has done

Granting loans to the needy people is one of the main objectives of Mahila Bachat Mandal. Members can also purchase large quantity of essential commodities in instalments like Oil, Wheat and Cereals & Pulses.

A loan of Rs. 10,000 can be availed which need to be repaid within a period of 10 months.

Jeevantirth takes many initiatives from time to time to improve the quality of life of the members ranging from organizing awareness programs, celebration of women's day, exposure tour, health camp, and such other activities.

Case Study

Kokilaben Dayabhai Parmar travels far and wide from dawn to dusk, barefooted and under the scorching heat, picking up wastes of the city just to earn Rs. 100 to 200 in the end of the day from the scrap dealer! But she is a mother and couldn't afford to rest or else her children will have to sleep hungry that night.

Then she decided to take a loan from Mahila Bachat Mandal, Jeevantirth, with the objective of buying a pedal rickshaw. It enabled her to work smart and earn more money. She repaid the loan on time out of her own savings. Looking at her transformation, many other rag pickers have registered themselves as SHG members and are doing well.

About the Program:

Having understood the fact that elderly people experience a stage of transition from independence to interdependence and then to total dependence, it becomes the responsibility of the society at large to let the senior citizens age gracefully and live with a sense of dignity and security. With this objective in mind, Jeevantirth has formed an informal association of senior citizens named "Nirant Vrudhdh Mandal" and provided a healthy platform to the elderly to come together and share a few moments of joy and laughter. It also facilitates to bridge the generational gap and spread a message of social cohesion through different programs and activities round the year, to mention a few are, Rakhi Celebration, Distribution of Sweets on Deepawali, and Sangeet Sandhya.

More than 150 elderly people have become a part of Nirant Vrudhdh Mandalsofar.

Considering the importance of religion and spirituality in old age, every week SATSANG is organized at our

Vocational Training Centre, Ramapirno Tekro and Ganeshnagar. It is a sacred gathering whereby the senior citizens sing bhajan or listen to any discourses on life and ageing.

Many philanthropists, concerned individuals and institutions like Lions Club, Give Forever, Apple Global School, and Aadarsh Amdavad render their valuable services to the elderly either by way of donating something or organizing programs.

Lok Seva Kendra

About the Program:

'Lok Seva Kendra' as the name suggests, aims to serve the downtrodden and disadvantaged groups of the society, for instance, elderly people, disabled, illiterates, and women and children living in slums. There are people around who finds joy and contentment in the service of others. Mother Teresa brilliantly pointed out, "At the end of life we will not be judged by how many diplomas we have received, how much money we have made, how many great things we have done. We will be judged by I was hungry, and you gave me something to eat, I was naked and you clothed me. I was homeless, and you took me in." With this philosophy, Jeevantirth formed Lok Seva Kendra in the year 2012 as one of its urban initiatives whereby people desiring to contribute something to the less privileged community, either in cash or kind, can find the right target group. It is acting as a facilitator between the donors and partner organizations and the real beneficiaries. Since its inception, Lok Seva Kendra has reached thousands of people meeting their various needs. Coordinator Kamlesh Dabhani has a team of around 30 dedicated volunteers who assist in the programs of Lok Seva Kendra.

Vocational Training Centre

The essence of vocational training is that it puts emphasis on development of particular skills and knowledge of a trainee. To undergo these types of handson training, academic qualification is not always a criterion. Hence, it is quite appealing to the large number of dropout living in and around Ramapir no Tekro. In the year 2016, Jeevantirth has focused on scaling up the Tailoring and Beautician courses at Jeevantirth Vocational Training Center, Vadaj.

Tailoring Course: Under the instruction and supervision of Mrs. Minaxi Dhairav, a total of 245 women and girls have successfully completed the tailoring course with a minimal monthly fee of Rs. 50 during 2016-17. The program allows a woman/girl to continue the course as long as she desires depending on her interests and ability to learn. For instance, some join the course to learn about stitching and embroidery only while others, about making blouse, salwar suit, frock etc. It is noteworthy to mention that out of these 245, 29 women have started their own tailoring unit and become self-reliant within a very short span of time.



beautician course at VTC, Vadaj, in association with Unnati, Bangalore. It is to mobilize the unemployed girls of Ramapir no Tekro and neighbouring areas. Handholding support is also provided to each successful candidate to get placement after the course. In each batch, there are around 8 to 10 students. Besides imparting them professional training, emphasis has also been laid upon their communication and body language which is an essential parameter in service industry. During 2016-17, 5 batches have undergone the training and 58 students have completed the course. Almost all the girls are now placed in well-known salons of the city including Herrlich Unisex Salon, Raj Salon (Akhbar Nagar), Sharma Salon (Ranip) and Sharma Salon (Bhimjipura).





by taking inspiration from Eklavya and ARCH from this year with active participation of Anusandhan. "Pitara" with the help of our "GyanVan" reaches to the schools with a treasure of educational books and toys. On the first day of the three-day program, children are motivated to read as many books as they can free so that they need not spent on them! On the second day we conduct many participatory reading activities like loud reading, book review, story creating, poetry reciting etc. to generate interest in reading. On the third day they purchase books that interested them the most. Seeing that the current generation of children are being void of this treasure, we decided to take a small step towards introducing them to the world of literature by means of book fairs.

Pitara include about 1,000 titles of books in three languages i.e. Gujarati, Hindi and English from various highly reputed publishing houses like Tulika, Eklavya, Pratham, CBT, NBT, NCERT etc. that are generally not available in market. Five book fairs have been conducted so far in which about 3,000 children benefitted. It is fascinating to see how underprivileged children save money from their pocket expenses to purchase books of their choice.

RTE Classes:

Under RTE Act-2009 willingly or unwillingly private schools do admit 25% children belonging to weaker disadvantaged group but because of their background they are unable to cope up with the normal students and sometimes school authorities and teachers are also not that sensitive to pay proper attention. During interaction principal of one of the school put challenge to our GCE team to help such students with special coaching and that is how RTE classes started in selective schools. With the extensive use of TLMs like cards for words, numbers, letters, pictures, charts of simple sentences, paragraph reading, pictorial stories, beads, coins, cowries, sticks, pebbles, dominoes, playing cards and dice etc. 225 children of 7 classes of three schools

learnt quite fast and the purpose of giving quality education to t h e underprivilege d children servedwell.





Tribal Initiatives

Initiative of Jeevantirth in tribal area especially in Narmada, Bharuch and Navsari districts provides an excellent example of how traditional healers, small and marginal farmers especially women and children have been brought under umbrella of livelihood and quality education enhancement. With financial support of NABARD, Gujarat Guardian Ltd, Gujarat Bio Diversity Board, Anand Krishi University, KVK and other different sources, Jeevantirth plays a significant role of technical support group, educator, motivator and also as facilitator.

Farmers Producers Organization:

'Direct to Consumer' or retail marketing will enable farmers to sell their products directly to the consumers thereby eliminating self-serving intermediaries. Jeevantirth believe that this can be integrated through model of organizing farmers in proper structure such as farmers Producer company or cooperative. As a result of Biodiversity project we have covered the entire Dediapada taluka under BMC's and formed 46 BMCs covering 163 villages.

NABARD-Bharuch and NABARD-Ahmedabad has seen the result of our work in Dediapada taluka related to medicinal plants and BMC network. They are regularly taking part in BMC meetings such as Bhaji Competition and various Biodiversity workshops. As a result of our network they have sanctioned two Farmers Producers Organisations (FPOs), one for sustainable Agriculture and other for Conservation and Plantation of Medicinal Plants.

Jeevantirth staff members has attended 3 programs organized by NABARD in Bharuch and Rajpipla. The programs was on strengthening the FPOs and increasing the income of farmers.

As a part of FPO we have initiated some business and got an order for Rs. 10 lacs for Khaati bhindi sherbet for the year 2017.

Jeevantirth is constantly in touch with Tata Consultancy Services for *mKrishi* Software. The software is focusing on all the basic level information of the farmers associated with FPOs. In long run this software will be very helpful for strengthening the business of the FPO.





A-Grade to Jeevantirth As an example of Public Private Partnership, Jeevantirth has developed prominent partnership with Govt., Semi govt., corporate and other organizations. The organization is ranked A-Grade due to the effective implementation of Biodiversity projects for establishing Biodiversity Management Committees (BMC) and preparation People's Biodiversity Registers (PBR).

Sanctioned amount is for 3 years. The funds for capacity building and registration will be given to Jeevantirth and Revolving funds and admistration assistance will be given to FPO once it gets registered.

One of the FPO has been registered under Cooperative Act. It is notable that the leaders of the organizations have initiated the registration process by their own.



An alternative livelihood

for Tribal Women.

The bakery Project is conceptualized with objective to provide alternative livelihoods to the members of Self Help groups in tribal villages of Dediapada. Jeevantirth has established the first women managed Bakery Unit with financial support of NABARD in year 2015. Considering the process of its establishment, Jeevantirth has provided extensive training to four members of the SHGs with technical support from Everfresh Bakery, Anand during July 2016. Mr. Zakirbhai and Mr. Guru Vasava - individual consultants - are providing technical assistance in operation of the unit regularly. The unit is now ready to produce Buns, bread, puffs, khari, nankhatai, jowar biscuits, makai biscuits, wheat biscuits, nagli/ragi, biscuits for sale on regular basis.

Jeevantirth also had participated in Agri-Asia Fair at Mahatma Mandir held at 2-3rd September 2016.

Training and Material Development

Science in Kitchen:

Jeevantirth is actively participating in Indradhanush program initiated by Essar Foundation for last four years and we develop new educational material to enlighten about 3,000 children from nearby schools. This year we developed the material and kit on the theme of Kitchen Science. We took this material to Jhankhvav also in the program organized by Fr Rony Saldana in which 3,000 students from nearby schools are invited every year. We conducted activities and experiments related to physics, chemistry and biology of kitchen along with Pitara - Treasure of Books activities for three days.

Learning the Treasure Within:

Adani Foundation invited Jeevantirth for one-day workshop on "Learning the Treasure Within" for the teachers of Hajeera-Dahej area which was well-attended. The subjects like 'pedagogy of education', 'use of TLMs', 'recommendations of the gunotsav committee' etc. were discussed during the workshop and teachers participated with full zeal.









Documentation:

On request from AKRSP (I), Jeevantirth took responsibility to document intermediate outcomes of AKRSP (India)'s interventions in 'Learning Enrichment Program' of LEARN project in selected villages of Wankaner Taluka, Morbi District [Gujarat]. This document provides analytical insights on current status of the programme's initial results. The primary objectives were:

- (1) To document the intermediate outcomes of the interventions related to learning enrichment programme and
- (2) To train LEP staff on preparation of Teaching and learning materials in a workshop and document the same.

Trainings:

Jeevantirth team conducted three day training workshop for about 100 teachers engaged in Environment Education in 50 villages of Halvad Taluka by Centre for Environment Education. The rationale of the training was to encourage the development of a culture of learning outside by linking learning outcomes and skills with experiences, interesting an approach that encourages interdisciplinary learning of environment with other subjects. Main Objectives were 1. Understanding EVS – What, Why, and How? 2. Using social and natural environment to enhance learning. 3. Orientation to various approaches in EVS. and 4. Understanding relation of EVS with language and mathematics.

One Day Introductory Workshop organized by Adani Foundation on 'Learning: the treasure within' was designed and conducted by Jeevantirth team in Hazira, Surat covering topics like (1) Fundamental Questions about Education, Why we Learn?, How we Learn? and What are the Learning Obstacles? (2) Pedagogy of Learning and What can be done to Facilitate Learning? (3) Understanding Recommendations of State Level Committee on "Gunotsav". (4) Welcome to the World of Origami (5) "Ganit No Ekko" Learning Maths through Playing Cards and (6) The Way forward: To work out Strategy for Quality Education.

Translation:

'The Water Security Plan' for Rapar Taluka in Kutch District of Gujarat is based on the analysis of the participatory micro planning exercise and feasibility study done in 97 revenue villages of Rapar Taluka during June -September 2015. Jeevantirth translated the report in Gujarati on request of SAMERTH so that it can be easily assessable to the ground level workers engaged in implementation to reduce the plight of the people living in scarcity zone.

CSR Projects

The Gujarat Guardian Limited extended financial assistance to initiate Quality Education Program with focus on Girl Child, in 10 Government schools in Dediapada block of District Narmada. 96.4% of total population in Dediapada is Tribal. During initial visits of the schools it was observed that even students of upper primary face problems in reading language and doing basic maths.

The main objective of the project is to improve the condition of 'Virtual Exclusion' - Virtual exclusion refers to children who are in school, but for whatever reason, not learning. Another important objective is to ensure transition of Girls from primary to secondary education.




Who wants to go to High School?



The project was kick-started in December 2016. After rigorous, cohesive training imparted to the selected 'Balmitras'-Education Volunteers who gained confidence in teaching and getting active participation of students in subjects with the help of innovative teaching methods and Teaching Learning Materials developed by Jeevantirth. In very short time, the Bal Mitras have developed good rapport with schools and children. It is also observed that the principal of schools have requested Bal Mitras to be present in staff meeting and share their experiences and support other teachers also for effective teaching. The results of this pilot project are encouraging and we look forward to have positive impact on Learning Outcomes of the students in next academic year.





In 2015 a team from Global Scholars Program run by University of Michigan, visited India in search of an NGO that would best suit for their exposure trip to India. Jeevantirth's intervention in the slums of Ahmedabad and in the tribal regions of Dediapada caught their interest, leading to their trip in May - June 2016. GSP's aim in uniting the diversity was evident by the fact that the students themselves came from various cultural backgrounds. Moreover they were all enrolled in different fields of studies. GSP is a livinglearning community in which students discuss global issues through a critical lens and facilitate dialogue about social justice, the interconnectivity of the world, and what it means to be a global citizen.

To grasp the socioeconomic status of RamaPirNo Tekro, the students surveyed more than 100 families. Their plight for survival and the vicious cycle of poverty that these communities are trapped in were apparent to the students.

GSP's report said, "Because many respondents lack basic physiological and safety necessities, such as access to food, water, and sleep, there is no room for other, secondary needs such as self-esteem, creativity, and confidence. Their conclusion was that there is a need for more quality and affordable primary education, women's health services, and incentives; all of which Jeevantirth has been working on incessantly.



Origami Workshop at IIT-Gandhinagar

As part of their foundation programme at IIT-Gandhinagar, students go through various training and workshops throughout their course. This year they had workshops of Warli art, painting, basic photography, juggling, theater, sculpture etc. They call experts in various subjects and expose the students to their faculties. For the workshop of Origami – Japanese art of paper folding – they called Jeevantirth's Raju and Deepti. The students got involved in Origami and learned basics of the art. They enjoyed making models like swan, rabbit, jumping frog and crane etc. Many students were fascinated making even a simple paper-boat!

Visit to AirShow - 2016

Even as grownups we find airplanes moving close overhead fascinating. Gujarat Aero Conclave organized an air-show, planes performing aerobatics, on 3th April 2016. 100 children from our Bal Sanksar Kendras satiated their fantasies; while the perfectly synced planes danced across the sky painting it with smoke in their wake, the children screamed and jumped with exuberance.
