



LIFETIME EMPOWERING GIFT OF LEARNING SKILLS

Often, when we refer BSKs - our non-formal education classes - we say that, "We shape the future of RamaPirNo Tekro and nearby slums here!" It is said that the mother gives biological birth to the child but teacher empowers the child by knowledge, skill and attitude to live the life of dignity. Who do not love their children? But the life of under-privileged section of society is so stressful that they do not find time from struggle to met two ends and daily chorus that they are unable to give due attention for the development of their offspring.

The programme is run by a group of committed "Baal Mitras" (Non-Formal Education teachers) who belong to the local community and have shouldered the responsibility of transforming the lives of children through education. They undergo different training programs and teachers' training workshops at regular intervals so as to deliver their best.







Because of school enrolment drive and RTE, children go to school but unfortunately do not learn because of so many reasons. We see basic "VaaGaLe" (Vaachan, Ganan, Lekhan) Reading, Writing and Arithmetic skill as a learning tool and we humbly believe that the life-time gift we can give to the slum children is this empowering tool. 500+ children come to our 15 BSKs daily and we try to make the process of learning joyful. For lower primary we focus on basic literacy, mathematical ability, health and hygiene and joy of childhood. For upper primary our focus is on learning outcomes as per their standard and citizenship training.

THREE MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- This year we got support for "Education through Computer and Computer Education" from Upendrabhai of Arpan Foundation, USA. Children and BalMitras have started making best use of it.
- Motivated by the initial support from Ms. Deepti Shah to provide writing desks to one BSK, we managed to provide desks to all the children of BSKs.
- This year during our staff trainings we gave maximum time in making and learning to use effectively TLMs.

BALAKALAKAR

Every Child is an Artist

"Balakalakaar" is organized every year by AIESEC for the underprivileged children of Ahmedabad city. On 15th September 2017, 200 children from Bal Sanskar Kendras, Jeevantirth, participated in the day-long program which was at the Avalon Hotel, off SG Highway. The day began with dancing to the tunes of some of the energetic rhythms of Bollywood along with the Smile agents. It was followed by individual and group performances by the children. As they came upon stage to perform, the hall applauded them with thunder of claps. It was really mesmerizing to witness such meticulous performances! Post-lunch, there was a drawing competition. There could not have better reward than providing scholarship for a year to the three winners from BSKs. The children also enjoyed an animated film, "Oogy and the Cockroaches".



RIDE IN VINTAGE CARS

Mr. Nirav Shah from Wake Up To Dream is actively involved with us. He makes sure that the children of Jeevantirth are reminded time and again of the fun that life is. Always he talks about the significance of fostering the uniqueness within each individual rather than curbing one's aspirations. The joy of realising one's dreams propels one to work further towards his/her ambition. In order to give the children of Jeevantirth a glimpse of this realisation Wake Up To Dream organised a vintage car ride on 16th April, 2017.



PRAYOGOTSAV

A week long program called Prayogotsav was organised in our BSKs during summer of 2017. Heerabhai Sisodiya from Gujarat Vidhyapith is an expert in conducting experiments for children to understand physics. He makes use of simple things like water bottles, cardboards, balloons, coins, magnets, etc. to impart knowledge about the laws of physics. The experiments hold their attention like a magic show; wide-eyed, they jump at every chance to guess at what would happen next! Understanding of vacuum, air, water, volume expansion and contraction, weight, gravity, center of gravity, oxygen, sound, etc. is imparted through practical experiments. Seeing the efficiency of these experiments we plan to organize a training session for our Baal-Mitras so they may too learn how to conduct them.

LIFE-ORIENTED LEARNING TO CELEBRATE PUBERTY & WOMANHOOD

GIVE US WINGS TO FLY AND FARTH TO REST OUR FFET!

GCE classes are conducted once a week, basically for the adolescent girls of Standard VI and above. Planning is made well in advance regarding how to execute the project under the expert guidance of Project Director. Every month, 2nd and 4th Tuesdays and Wednesdays are allotted for capacity building of the Facilitators. They need to go through training on each module before they go to the classrooms so that they could deliver their best and see the desired impact.

They are also provided all necessary TLM (Teaching Learning Material) to make the learning more effective. The Coordinator makes sure that she visits along with the facilitators very often to guide and make live contact with the school authority so that feedback from their side is received and no inconvenience is faced later. During her visits she appreciates the efforts of Facilitators when they perform well and make necessary interventions if needed.

IN VALUE EDUCATION, LEARNING IS LIVING AND LIVING IS LEARNING

During the period of adolescence, a child undergoes several distinct and unique changes: biological, cognitive and socio-emotional. Sometimes they feel isolated and vulnerable. Merely teaching and preaching do not work at this age. With the financial support of Narain-das Mor-bai Budhrani Trust, the facilitators of Jeevantirth conduct interactive sessions on various topics like goal setting, time management, anger management, stamp out stress, unclutter your mind, etc. so that they inculcate positive values in their life.

The Modules are designed on the basis of the book 'Be in the driver's seat' written by Dada J.P.Vasvani. The aim of the project is to make them realize that we need to take charge of our own destiny.

Values are virtues that are imbibed by the children from their surroundings, the environment in which they are brought up, the environment in which they live. The people around them play a vital role in leaving an impression on the tender minds of these young individuals. Values cannot be taught by preaching or teaching. In our VEP we conduct participatory elective process and encourage the students to think, discuss among themselves in small groups and decide on their own what is right and what is wrong.

We humbly believe that with the increasing trend of nuclear families, parents working round the clock, absence of grandparents and elderly in the family, role of the school and particularly the teacher become imperative to ensure that values are interwoven in all her lessons she takes up with her students.





IMPORTANT ACHIEVEMENTS

Students of Sadhu Vaswani, NalandaPrathmik Shala, Bhadhreshwar School donated pen, pencil, clothes to the children who are in need at the time of Diwali.

This year we arranged Essay, Elocution and Drama competition in all 8 schools. The objective behind it was to develop the skill of children and remove the stage fear and they become aware about the social issues of the society. Inter School Competition was a great success.

During the year we celebrated different types of days like Children Day, Teachers Day, World AIDS Day, TB Day, Diwali, Christmas, Women's Day etc and explained the importance on the same.


All the activity sheets were very attractive this year. Students liked it and they shared it with parents.

With the generous support of The Serenity Trust these children spend their day with nature and get enriched from within. Nature trail, bird watching, identification of trees, observing life cycle of butterfly, understanding medicinal values of herbal plants, nutrition garden, rare and rich collection of books on nature, cafeteria to share Tiffin, nature films and host of educational activities make their day. Our team contacts schools, fix up the dates and program, make transport arrangements through "Aapni Bus", take care of their safety and facilitate nature education training by passionate and expert educators so that they go home transformed! They become nature lover and also sensitive for the environmental issues



NATURE EDUCATION PROGRAM



RECONNECTING WITH SELF BY CONNECTING WITH NATURE

Children are born with a sense of wonder and an affinity for Nature. Properly cultivated, these values can mature into ecological literacy, and eventually into sustainable patterns of living.

This year The Serenity Trust allowed us to take 300+ children for the Night Camp also. It was adventurous and exiting experience for most of the children to go for night trail, do campfire and stay in tents.

RIGHT TO EDUCATION HAS NO MEANING WITHOUT QUALITY EDUCATION

The Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009, is an Act which describes the modalities of the importance of free and compulsory education for children between 6 and 14 years in India under Article 21A of the Indian Constitution. The Bal Mitras of Jeevantirth travelled nook and corner of different slums of the project area of Urben Initiative and documented the details of such underprivileged children (OBC/Minorities/ SC/ ST/ Orphans/ Disabled/ Migrant & Street Children) and helped them to get admission in premier schools under the Right to Education Act enabling them to receive quality education.

During one of the discussion with the trustees and principals of private schools, one of the trustee put the challenge to help the children admitted under RTE by support education program so that their mainstreaming become easy. These children are coming from socio-economically and educationally backward communities and they face many learning difficulties.







Our facilitators go to the schools regularly and make them learn with the help of pre-learning activities and TLMs. The results are quite encouraging. In a course of time we realised that they have almost no exposure to pre-school education and for them full day school from the first standard become burdensome. They lost their freedom of childhood and feel trapped within the four walls of the school for longer period engaged in disinterested activities!

We started two hour classes for the children whom we motivated and helped in applying for getting the admission under RTE. Kalarav is a place for them for learning with fun. The response is overwhelming and parents have also started realising the importance of pre-school education now.



VAAGALE UTSAV - QEP CSR PROJECT



Adani Foundation adopts an integrated approach to improve the quality of education in the rural as well as urban areas, along the lines of UN's Sustainable Development Goals. SDG-4 speaks about quality education - "Ensure inclusive and quality education for all and promote lifelong learning". The education sector is at the forefront of the foundation as it can be the true catalyst to bring change in not just an individual but the entire community as a whole. In the year 2017-18 in partnership of Jeevantirth, Adani Foundation initiated the VaaGaLe Utsav: Quality Education Program in ten schools of Hazira area.

WHAT WERE THE KEY ISSUES?

Virtual Exclusion – Children going to school but not learning for whatever reasons is the biggest challenge in our education system. Many children of the schools are of the migrant labourers and hence even Gujarati is a new language for them. After long deliberations with Jeevantirth and AF Hazira team based on the initial experiences and feedbacks from the field; it was felt that to have a long lasting impact on the quality of education, we need to have a strategic plan for at least five years. It was also felt that the "VaaGaLe Utsav" needs to be extended horizontally and vertically for greater impact.

QUALITY EDUCATION PROGRAM



INDIA NEEDS TO INVEST MOST FOR HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT

Under the guidance of project coordinator, two educational volunteers - Baal Mitras - regularly visited five-five schools every week and focused on the learning difficulties of the children. Joyful Pre-reading and writing activities carried out in the initial months laid a strong foundation for the construction of knowledge in the students. Extensive and judicious use of Teaching Learning Materials, Art & Craft activities, Exhibitions, Mobile Library, Mobile Laboratory, AV CDs kept the joy of learning alive in the young minds. Almost every month 'School on Wheels' visited the project schools with new educational program of the month.

We are happy to note that UNICEF, Gujarat team visited and appreciated the project. Based on the learnings of the first year Jeevantirth and AF Hazira team is working on the strategy to work more vigorously in the next academic year so that project impact can have long lasting positive effects in the lives of new learners.








SUZUKI CSR PROJECT

Suzuki CSR team and Jeevantirth jointly decided to carry out Entry-Point Activities in the nearby villages to assess the needs of the area in the field of education as education is the only means of social change and progress. To catch the attention of all the stakeholders - the children, teachers and local people - it was decided to have one round of "School on Wheels' in the few selected villages nearby Hansalpur. It was followed by a workshop for the teachers.

We found that the villages near Hansalpur Suzuki Plant falls in the border areas of three districts namely Ahmadabad, Mahesana and Surendranagar. As they are relatively far from the district headquarters and most people are coming from socio-economically and educationally backward communities there is less development in the area. Literacy rate was 51.64 as compared to 58.95 in Gujarat in 2001. About 80% of working population is involved in primary economic activities and 50.82% are agriculture labourers.







DEDIAPADA - GEP

With the initial support from Gujarat Guardian Limited (ModiGuard) under CSR, we initiated the pilot project of "Quality Education Program" in ten villages of Dediapada previous year. It was six month project as we started during the second term of the academic year. Six months is a short period but the results were encouraging and we also got official permission from the education department to continue the program this year also. We continued the positive intervention in spite of non availability of CSR fund because a new relationship was built with the children, schools and education department. Jyoti and Varsha worked for the whole academic year and helped children to learn. Quality Education for all is separate SDG and we need to work in partnership with the Government and Corporate so that we can create a learning society with enlightened citizens.







DEVELOPMENT OF VOCATIONAL SKILLS AND LIFE-SKILLS THAT ENSURES EMPLOYMENT

In partnership with Unnati, Bangalore we started VTC in the year 2010-11 giving soft skills in the field of Security, Retail Marketing and Beauty Parlour. We were also running Sewing Classes for the women of the area.

Importance of vocational training can never be underestimated. Not all children can go for higher education in the present scenario. Especially underprivileged urban and rural youth need employable skill so that they earn a decent amount to live a life with dignity. Education and employment are transforming forces. Our 50 day program contains Computer literacy, spoken English, life-skill education and value education. Basic values like regularity, punctuality, decent behaviour, avoiding un-necessary leave, be alert on work are some of the virtues employer expect from the employee. Our success are based on inculcation these values in the trainees.








At present we run Tailoring, Beauty Parlour and Computer classes at Jeevantirth. We also feel that along with full flagged VTC we need to run short time and duration courses like Spoken English, Computer Skills, Personality Development, Interview and Communication Skills etc so that working youths can also join the course as per their convenience and need. This will help them in getting promotion or better job with more salary. Another advantage is they become conscious and active for self development.

Through VTC we want to provide a platform to the youth so that they can transform their life by moving ahead in positive direction.

HELPING RAG-PICKERS WOMEN TO HELP THEMSELVES

As an organization committed to work for the vulnerable sections of the society, we realized the hardships the women in the slum encounters in their day to day life and hence, took up the challenge of empowering the women of Ramapirno Tekro through formation of Mahila Bachat Mandal.

It began its functioning in a full-fledged manner since July, 2011, with the appointment of a full time Program Coordinator, Dhairav Minaxi Chandrakant. It was a consensus decision of the members to contribute Rs. 100 per month in the initial 2 years which was later enhanced to Rs. 200 per month from the year 2013. As the saying goes 'Hard work pays off' Mahila Bachat Mandal is now a federation of 35 different groups with around 1,300 members and still counting!











SKILLS AND LIFE-SKILLS THAT

Minaxiben and her team have earned confidence and high reputation in the community that our money is safe and micro-credit activities really benefit all. It's a win-win situation and brings peace, prosperity and comradeship in the community. SHGs federation gives micro credits to needy members for education, health, livelihood for household expenditures. Now they have also initiated Aapni dukan – a shop of the women, by the women and for the women.

One of our major accomplishments in recent times is that Giants Group of Ahmedabad, partnered with Jeevantirth for its first ever Mega Project on Women Empowerment on September 24, 2017, The project was launched in the presence of World Chairperson Giants International, Shaina NC, who came to attend the ceremony all the way from Mumbai. Under the project revolving fund of 25 Lac will be created to be utilised for the benefits of the women. This initiative will pave the way for empowerment of around 1,300 SHG (Self Help Group) members of Jeevantirth majority being rag-pickers. Shaina NC expressed her gratitude towards these women for their contribution towards keeping the city clean and healthy, traveling far and wide collecting the garbage amidst all adversities, and appreciated Jeevantirth for its active and supportive role in bringing social change.

ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT WORKSHOP

11 SHG members participated in the 5-Day Entrepreneurship Development Workshop organized by NEEV, IIT Gandhinagar, whereby they got orientation on how to generate business ideas and carry it forward under the expert guidance of B R Venkatesh and Amit Mere from MBLTA, Mumbai.

WOMEN'S BANK



A loan of Rs. 5,000 to 10,000 can be availed by a member who needs to repay within a period of 10 months. Education, Medical treatment, Self-employment remains the priority in granting loans. Members can also purchase large quantity of essential commodities in instalments like Oil, Wheat, Rice, Cereals & Pulses. They are given Gas Connections, Steel Cupboards, Home Mini-Floor Mills and Freeze also as per their need!

"Self-help is the best help", is an old proverb that means one should help him or herself and not wait for others to come to one's help.

The very existence of SHGs is highly relevant to make the people of below poverty line hopeful and self-reliant. SHGs enable them to Increase their income, improve their standard of living and status in society. It acts as a catalyst for bringing this section of society to the main stream.







THE OLDER WE GET, THE MORE WE VALUE EVERYTHING THAT OUR PARENTS GAVE US!

With the initial support of Arpan Foundation USA in 2015-16, Jeevantirth initiated "Matru-Pitru Devo Bhava" project in 20 Tribal villages of Dediapada, District Narmada to serve the elders.

SPARSH owned this project to support and now along with the Satsang, Nutrition, Health Check-Ups and Medical Support we are also supporting them to avail benefit of Government Schemes like Old-Age Pension and others. Our aim is to re-kindle love and joy in the lives of isolated vulnerable elders by re-uniting with families and each-other.

In the year 2019, we are going to celebrate 150th birth year of Baa and Bapu. Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose first addressed Gandhiji as Father of the nation in his condolence message to the Mahatma on the demise of Kasturba.

KiritBhai from Aadarsh, Ahmedabad, delivered a lecture on specific dietary needs in old age at VTC, Vadaj. We know that factors like poverty, unhygienic environment, isolation and boredom affect the health and well-being of the elderly. Therefore, adequate nutrition and a well-balanced diet are of vital importance with growing years so as to prevent and control the common hazards of aging.

Hearing impairment is a common phenomenon that occurs in most of us as we grow older. We feel grateful to Mr. Pankaj Seth of Give Forever who always becomes bridge in helping the needy people of area. With the support of deeply spiritual couple who believe in anonymous donations, best quality of hearing aid was provided to 76 years old ChaturBhai.

Education is a basic human right and a universal human value which should be available over the entire life of each individual. Education is also the responsibility of the whole of society: all persons involved and all partnerships – in addition to those incumbent on institutions. Looking to these considerations we run "School on Wheels" to bring quality education at their doorsteps for the vulnerable section of the society especially rural children and schools.

Every year during the vacation we run the schools in villages near Vada of Banaskantha district. Children and the village people now waits eagerly to enjoy new activities every specially design for them. SoWs was also run throughout the year in ten schools of Hazira area under the VaaGaLe Utsav, supported by Adani Foundation and ten schools of Dediapada taluka. 2017-18 was also accident year for the SoWs as three times it met with the accidents!






This year SoWs got new getup also! We have aligned our activities with Global Sustainable Development Goals and our painter Dashrathbhai has groomed the SoWs with beautiful paintings.

It is needless to say that we need to equip individuals and societies with the skills, perspectives, knowledge and values to live and work in a sustainable manner. There cannot be equality and justice if vulnerable section of the society is deprived of the quality education. We need to apply trance disciplinary educational methods and approaches to develop an ethic for lifelong learning. "School on Wheels" wants to nurture reverence for life and spread Joy, Love and Understanding among the new generation. We want to extend the services of SoWs for community education also.

School on Wheels (SOW) is an integrated approach towards improving the quality of education for underprivileged children especially rural children who have limited exposure. The project has been implemented in the rural – tribal areas of Banaskantha, Dediapada and Hazira, Surat. The key component of the project is a designed mini-truck to provide additional educational facilities to rural children and village dwellers. Other key components of the project include a community based educational programme, school partnership programme and working with adolescent children from the community. Every year the project is directly benefitting more than 5,000 children between the age group of 3-18 years.



PITARA: READING FESTIVAL

Reading is not just an important professional skill. It is also a way to enjoy informative, creative, and inspiring works of literature that enrich our life experiences. Like any skill worth mastering, a reading habit requires time and dedication to develop. It is, however, a lifelong source of enjoyment and entertainment and an affordable hobby for anyone who wants to pick up a book.

Pitara is the treasure of books and educative toys which we take to the schools. It's three day event, on the first day we display more than 1500+ titles of books from various reputed publishers who are in to education and want to give best reading material to the children as per their reading skills and interest. Such books are not easily available in market. Class by class come to the book fair and we encourage them to read as many books as they can! In most of the cases we have observed that they just can't believe their eyes that such

wonderful books are available for them. On the second day we conduct many reading activities with them and on the third day they are encouraged to purchase books of their choice.

At present we have started organising such book fairs in schools but we are also planning to conduct such exhibition cum sale of the books at different societies, institutes, business houses, factories, public places and public events where people come and enjoy the treasure of books. This year 2,500 children of schools and non-formal education centres benefited enjoyed the activities of PITARA. In addition to that, as a part of Girl Child Education program special module was designed on "The wonder world of books!" Set of books with exhibition were displayed to 1,000 teenage girls followed by the discussion on the treasure books have hidden among pages. We want to take up the activity on mission mode with social business angle. At present we are investing lot of our time and money to organise such fairs but we feel that in long run it should self-sustaining activity.

Book fairs give children a motivation to read by offering them a wide selection of books to choose from that they can look at before they decide to buy.





MAKING SLUM-DWELLERS ENLIGHTENED CITIZENS, BY FRANCHISING THEIR RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES!

"Lok Seva" as the name suggests, aims to serve the downtrodden and disadvantaged groups of the society, for instance, elderly people, disabled, illiterates, and women and children living in slums. There are people around who finds joy and contentment in the service of others. People desiring to contribute something to the less privileged community, either in cash or kind, can find the right target group. It is acting as a facilitator between the donors and partner organizations and the real beneficiaries. Since its inception, Lok Seva Kendra has reached thousands of people meeting their various needs. Lok Seva Kendra has a wide spectrum of activities to follow, be it individual need or welfare of the community.

Moreover, the community has its own issues related to health & hygiene, pollution, employment and many more which are to be addressed at the larger level. Coordinator Kamlesh Dabhani has a team of around 30 dedicated volunteers who assist in the programs of Lok Seva Kendra.



On the occasion of World Population Day, it was great to see students of Gujarat University visiting home to home covering around 200 families in order to make them aware and sensible about issues related to unstoppable population growth.



FLOOD RELIEF

This year flood in Gujarat created unprecedented havoc in Banaskantha. Jeevantirth had been active in the locality since past 4 years through its School on Wheels program. Hence, it realised the heartfelt situation of the people who were spending sleepless nights on the roof as the houses were almost submerged under the water! Within no time, it raised 500 Grocery Kit, 4,500 food packages, 3,000 packets of biscuits and snacks, and hundreds of new clothes which were later distributed to the needy families after consulting the Sarpanch and community leaders.

Kamleshbhai and his team is ever ready to guide the slum dwellers how to get Election Card, Aadhar Card, PAN card, get benefits of Government schemes of social welfare and solve the problems with the Government agencies. In addition to that LSK provides the platform for good intentioned people in identifying right target group for humanitarian work of their choice. His meticulous planning and self-less impartial approach is liked by many people and organisations.

The list of the activities carried out under LSK is a long one and cannot be quantified to some extent but the monitory value of the support we received in kind through LSK is about 25 Lac.

Lok Seva Kendra has a wider spectrum of activities to follow, be it individual need or welfare of the community. We all can make a difference in the lives of others in need, because it is the most simple of gestures that make the most significant differences.

AADI AUSHADHI- SAVING TRADITIONAL WISDOM TURNING IT INTO MONEY

The extract from Capital Post about AadiAushadhi: June 11, 2018

The popularity of herbal medicine is growing by leaps and bounds in the global market. However in spite of the fact that India is seen as a reservoir of medicinal herbs, the country lags far behind in the exported value and market share. Now Dr. Lancelot Dcruz comes up with commendable works.

The Vasavas – a major tribe in Gujarat – ADI AUSHADHI - have deep knowledge of their habitat including traditional medicinal plants about which they have learnt and preserved over millennia. However, much of their knowledge is preserved in oral tradition and there are hardly any written records and documentation of their rich traditional medicinal knowledge.

Five Key Areas Covered by AAG

Social Education (group formation)
Financial Support (initiating thrift and credit)
Natural Resources Management (starting profitable production methods including organic farming)
Market Engagement (setting up a network and retail outlets for sale)

Product Innovation (diversifying and developing unique herbal food products)



PRESERVING BIODIVERSITY

Jeevantirth played an important role as a Technical Support Group in implementing Biodiversity projects initiated and sponsored by Gujarat Biodiversity Board, National Biodiversity Authority and United Nations Environment Program – Global Environment Fund the entire Dediapadataluka and formed 46 Biodiversity Management Committees covering 163 villages. Jeevantirth also facilitated in making Public Biodiversity Registers and strengthening of BMCs.

Celebrating Nature's bounty by none other than people who are very close to mother earth in the middle of the forest is an experience that will be cherished by all 123 participants who attended the training program on Biodiversity Access and Benefits Sharing held at Nivalda, Dediapada on 10th August 2017.

The program was organized to train the BMC members of Dediapada taluka on Access and benefit sharing under UNEP-GEF program.

Dr. Sanju Sharma, State Project Coordinator, Biodiversity Board spoke about the roles and responsibilities of BMC committees and its importance on village economy and its ecosystem is the lifeline of our country. She also mentioned how the benefits flows to the members of Adiaushadhi. She also advised to the BMC participants to grow more number of medicinal plants and supply to Adiaushadhi. She also told that the Adiaushahid is the first organization who has signed the ABS Agreement with Gujarat Biodiversity Board. The biodiversity act and its programs in the coming days will play a vital role in empowering the local people.

MAKING AN ECO-VILLAGE



Gujarat Ecology Commission

Forests and Environment Department Government of Gujarat

Gujarat Ecology Commission took up Dhaj for its Model Eco-Village Development Project; it is the first of its kind in Gujarat to adopt sustainable development and is expected to act as a role model for growth for other villages.

Dhaj is surrounded by forest and receives good rainfall. However the villagers experience water shortage for irrigation in other seasons. This is due to water runoff and lack of proper water harvesting and storage system in the village. To ensure the village's water safety GEC decided to construct bore-well recharge systems in the village.

Jeevantirth took up the challenge and helped the local agency to construct deep aquifer recharge systems. Having surveyed best spots for water recharging, we constructed 5 bore-wells in these brooks. Small "Bori Bandhs" are built near the bore-wells to stop water from flowing away. Jeevantirth took up the challenge and helped local agency for the construction of five deep aquifer recharge systems – recharge tubewells.





FARMERS PRODUCERS ORGANIZATION



PROMOTING FPOs

NABARD, Bharuch and Ahmedabad have seen the result of our work in Dediapada taluka related to Aadi Aushadhi, medicinal plants and BMC network. They also Helped us in establishing first ever Bakery in Gujarat run by Tribal Women. As a result of our network they sanctioned proposals of the formation and strengthening of two Farmers Producers Organisations (FPOs).

First Adiaushadhi FPO got registration under the Gujarat Cooperative's Act 1961 on 20th June 2017 and first general body meeting was held on 11th August 2017.

The MLA of Dediapada, Collector of Narmada, Mamlatdar and few other officers were present during the meeting. Scientists from Krishi Vigyan Kendra also participated in this meeting.

Jeevantirth staff members attended 3 programs on strengthening the FPOs and increasing the income of Farmers organized by NABARD in Ahmedabad, Bharuch and Rajpipla during the year. Three day Medicinal Plants Training was organized in August with the active support of Anand Agriculture University.

As a part of strengthening the FPO, we participated in 'SarasMela' at Mumbai in January 2018 and sold the products like Ashwagandha Shatavari biscuits, Mahua cake, Khati bhindi sherbet, traditional Rice and Jowar. We also participated in national level events 'Adivasi Ekta Parishad' at Rajpipla. An exposure visits organized at Prantij taluka to see the modern techniques of agriculture practices. A total of 52 FPO members participated in this trip.

THE ANNUAL FLOWER SHOW

The Annual Flower Show on the Sabarmati Riverfront at Sardar Bridge was inaugurated by Hon'ble Chief Minister of Gujarat Shri Vijay Rupani. The Flower Show was remained open from 10 am to 9 pm from 31st December 2017 to 11th Jan 2018.

Total selling of the products of our FPO during the Flower Show was of Rs. 2,59,680/-. Expenses was 1,47,830 and made clear profit of 1,11,850.

INCULCATION VALUES FOR ENHANSING HAPPINESS

Training and Material Development is an integral part of Jeevantirth and in-house training for all the project team members on regular bases in a way of life in Jeevantirth. We have five day week in our Non-formal Education Program (Baal Sanskar Kendras) and alternate Saturdays are dedicated to Training and Material Development. In all other educational programs like Girl Child Education, Value Education, VaaGaLe Utsav, RTE and others also we give need based training to our staff.

As a part of supporting ten schools of Hazira area for strengthening Praygna Approach, Adani Foundation decided to provide Teaching Learning Materials base on Praygna Approach. Jeevantirth took the responsibility to design, develop and provide TLMs with effective training to the concern teachers so that best use can be made for effective learning. Looking to the time and budget constraints, Jeevantirth Material Development Team worked out a plan in which about 25 TLM Kits were developed for the early learner of standard 1 and 2. The treasure bag of TLMs contains 15 Kits for Language and 10 Kits for Maths. During visit of UNICEF Team at Hazira, TLMs were displayed to them and they appreciated the effort. Training was also given to BaalMitras and local school teachers.









