




ABOUT US

About "Bal Sanskar Kendras":

With the generous and continuous support from Gisela Foundation, Netherlands we are building the future of slum children. Quality Education is a matter of great concern world over and for India it's a big challenge. This year children of Bal Sanskaar Kendras learnt very well "VaaGaLe" (Waachan-Reading, Ganan-Basic mathematic operations and Lekhan-Writing) as a learning tool. It was also celebration of childhood time. Children had enjoyed the process throughout the year and did well in exams. It is notable that out of total 752 children. 672 students were appeared in examination where 233 children passed exam with A grade, 278 children with B and 152 children with C Grade. This year Baal Sanskar children have also participated in program organized by Manthan Educational Programme Society, India in association with Khoj Museum and Jeevantirth is happy to announce the launch of the Global Premier of the Play "Gandi Baat" on the Pollution in the oceans carried out by Baalmitra students. Rotary President Shri Mehulbhai also visited schools and after getting positive responses from the schools said all the BaalMitras (Educational Volunteers) that "I salute you all for your outstanding work"!

GIVE US WINGS TO FLY AND EARTH TO REST OUR FEET!

Girl Child Education Programme is long term intervention of Jeevantirth targeting adolescent girls to enhance their functional ability and skills and make the girls aware of their specific rights. Through Girl Child Education, we not only reach out to such girls and make them aware of their true potential but equip them with requisite knowledge and skills to enable them shoulder the responsibilities of home as well as contribute towards the development of the nation while enjoying womanhood. After visit of Gisela Foundation representatives Peter and Joke the team was so motivated that they put target of 1,500 Teenage girls for the GCE Project. They want to help these girls to be "Lifelong Learners", help them to celebrate womanhood, make them ready to face future challenges and Make them concerned enlightened citizens so that they play their positive role in society and assert their rights and franchise responsibilities. To achieve Mission 1500 they negotiated with new schools and got positive responses. About 1437 teen-aged girls of standard 6 to 8 from about 16 schools and 1 colony have benefited through this program.

GIRL CHILD EDUCATION - DEDIAPADA

By educating a girl child, you educate the entire family.

Narmada district in Gujarat is located at the southern part of Gujarat. The district shares its border with the State of Maharashtra. The district has 4 talukas, which includes Nandod, Sagbara, Tilakwada and Dediapada. Dediapada Taluka has Tribal population with Literacy rate of Male 50.23% & Female 28.15%. It was felt that due to 'School Enrollment Drive" children do get enrolled in the schools but they drop out (rather pushed out) from the school system because of 'Virtual Exclusion' -Virtual exclusion refers to children who are in school, but for whatever reason, not learning. Another problem was - Not Making the Transition to Secondary - Of the children who complete primary, most of them fail to make the transition to secondary. This is more in the case of girl child.

Salient features of the project:

- 1. Project covered 5 Villages of Dediapada.
- 2. Ashram Shalas Residential Schools having girl child were given top priority.
- 3. Main focus was on Upper Primary, from Standard 6th to 8th.
- 4. Due emphasis was given on Need base education, Education for Sustainable Development, Life Skill education and Personality Development.

Following Ashram Shalas were selected for the project implantation.

We are happy to note that instead of 5 Schools we selected 6 Schools and covered more girls (285) than target of 250.



Project Deliverables:

In the beginning we carried out many rapport building activities and then initially we focused on their basic literacy, reading and writing proficiencies. We focused on girls that were academically legging behind and tried to fill the bridge by accelerated learning. Then we started teaching lessons based on Government's Curriculum and Text Books. The Girl- Child Education Program (GCE) of Jeevantirth attend the objective of changing the prejudices that families have about girls - like girls are slow learners, they are not rational; they are to be confined inside the domestic household, and why bother about educating them.

IN VALUE EDUCATION, LEARNING IS LIVING AND LIVING IS LEARNING

Traditionally the objectives of value-education were based on religion and philosophy. There was no secular value-education; but in today's modern world, this has been taken as very much essential.

Some of the objectives for value-education may be taken up as follows:

- 1. Inculcation of good manners and of responsible and cooperative citizenship.
- 2. Developing respect for the dignity of individual and society.
- 3. Developing a democratic way of thinking and living.
- 4. Developing sense of brotherhood at social, national and international levels.
- 5. Helping pupils to have faith in themselves.
- 6. Enabling pupils to make decisions on the basis of sound moral principles.

Jeevantirth is implementing Value Education Program with the support of Naraindas Morbai Budhrani Trust in 8 schools for 1,733 students of standard 6th, 7th and 8th in Ahmedabad. The success of the project goes to well designed modules and committed facilitators.

During the first session of standard 8th of MD school. When the first module "Rapport Building" was going on, the students were asked to share the happiest moment of the life. One of the student of the class shared that my happy moment of the life is that I am sharing this in front of you! This shows that how the students are associated with the facilitator and value education program. Principal of M.G. School wished both the facilitators "Happy Teachers Day" and gave bouquet to both the facilitators. That shows that principal respect the facilitators and gave importance to value education program.





KALRAV

With the support of Gisela Foundation we started Kalrav Centres last year for the Early Child Education. Children come, play and learn fun-way as a preparation for the coming school days of rigorous learning. This idea came in to our mind while working with the RTE Children who get admission in private schools due to the provision of Right to Education Act. Many children drop-out because of long school hours and difficult learning process of reading, writing and doing basic mathematics. Pre-learning fun activities generate interest in learning and they form good habits of going regularly to play and learn.

The Serenity Library and Botanical Garden is situated far from the noise of the city on Bhat-Koteshwar road. With the generous support from The Serenity Trust, Jeevantirth is conducting Nature Education Program for about 5,000+ Under-privileged children every year. Children enjoy their day with nature and become sensitive towards environment by taking pledge to plant and protect trees; to eliminate waste and reduce use of water, electricity, paper and plastic in daily life.

Children produce excellent "Nature Craft" during the camp; learn about trees and birds, spent quality time with nature and themselves during "Moun/Silent Sessions" and take Nature Trails. Two lakes give glimpses of aquatic life and water birds while Butterfly Garden provides knowledge about their life cycle. We also provide activity sheets to learn various environmental aspects and screen environmental films. Children also learn lessons of environment studies by first hand experiences.

Total 4,537 children visited The Serenity Library in the year 2017-18 while in the year 2018-19 we covered 6,303 children. In the case of Night Camps against 300 children in 2017-18 this year 561 children were covered. Month wise break-up is as under.

Every year our batch starts from 5th June, World Environment Day with the children of our BSKs in RamaPirNoTekro and other slums. Students of Girl Child Education, Value Education and Right To Education projects also benefited. With pro-active support of Taluka Primary Education Offices Pinkeshbhai, rural as well as urban Government Schools also got benefit of the program. Our resource team was invited by D. P. Schools in Carnival and facilitated as a guest of honor in the program. Every year we add new activities, games and modules to make program more interesting and educative.

RIGHT TO EDUCATION HAS NO MEANING WITHOUT QUALITY EDUCATION

Right to Education and Under-privileged children:

In the era of Liberalization - Globalization -Privatization, education has also become a big business. In many developing countries on one side there is a vulgar commercialization of education and on the other side poor children don't get quality education in public school. Realizing this Government has forces to private schools to reserve 25% sets for under-privileged children from the near-by area. Because of Virtual Exclusion (Children go to school but do not learn) in Government schools, parents aspire to send their children in private schools but they cannot bear the expanses. Under RTE Government pays the fees. We decided to help those parents and students to get admission and give hand-holding support to the children, parents and teachers so that poor children can also avail quality education.





Right to Education Registration Process:

Jeevantirth team worked day and night to fill-up the forms of RTE as most of the parents are ill-literate and do not know how to fill up the on-line application. About 800 forms were filled by Jeevantirth team and we are happy to inform that 600 plus children got admission in nearby private schools under RTE this year.

In the year 2018-19 we are supported 319 1st Standard Students, 134 2nd Standard Students and about 20 3rd Standard Students.

Work done by the RTE team:

- 1. RTE Training for Baalmitras
- 2. Baalmitra Training on TLMs
- 3. Classroom Teaching using TLMs
- Other activities
- 5. Progress Review of children
- 6. Supervision and monitoring

Children enjoyed the process of learning by TLMs. Schools also appreciated our work.





When Vision-Mission are clear, work itself will speak!

The VaaGaLe project was conceived to make impact on the concept, methodology and program of lower primary education system by giving basic literacy and mathematical ability – life time gift - to the rural children based on the principle of constructing knowledge. The Project also made them Life-Long Learners! 10 Schools of Hazira Area were covered. In the second year of the project our Strategic Thrusts was:

Pre Reading and Pre Writing Activities in Standards 1 and 2, Developing and Testing VaaGaLe Material, Ensuring VaaGaLe Competencies in Standard 3 and 4. Involving SMCs.

Pre-learning activities are important to develop motor-skill in the children and they develop their interest in learning and also boost their imaginations. Learning is fun!


INDIA NEEDS TO INVEST MOST FOR HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT

During first year we could not do much in involving School Management Committees in the process of education. This year, first we meet personally to all the SMC Members then tried to be present in SMC meetings at school level and took in to confidence local school authority that by making SMCs more active we can work in harmony for quality education. Ultimately we could organize SMC Workshop also at project level.

And now the Impact!

Ultimately the results count. We are happy to inform that against all odds; Knowledge-Gyan, Skill- Bhakti and Attitude – Karma of our BaalMitras brought good results. Children are learning to the best of their capacities. The results of Baseline-Endline Assessment in Standard 3rd and 4th were also quite encouraging.





SUZUKI CSR PROJECT

Jeevantirth is implementing Quality Education for All project in partnership with Suzuki Motor Gujarat CSR. This project is designed for 5 years and would be covering 5000 children in 24 Government Primary Schools of 18 villages falling under Surendra Nagar, Mehsana and Ahmedabad districts. The project is also aiming to increase awareness among the youth, parents and School Management Committee (SMC) members. The project got approved in the month of August 2018 and formally launched in all the schools in the month of October 2018.

The Strategic Thrust of the Project are:

- To make strong foundation of elementary education by functional literacy and basic mathematical ability and to create conducive learning environment in schools so that actual learning takes place.
- To create platform for learning, education and awareness in women, youth and farmers who are main stakeholders in village development.

The year one of the project (August 2018 to March 2019) emphases upon rapport building with the Government teachers and children in the project schools. Also, the first year focuses on School support Programme - VaaGaLe (Reading, Writing & Basic mathematical skills) and co-curricular activities. This has provided a great opportunity and entry point to build acceptance of the project interventions among Government teachers and children.







The major achievement of the first year of the project is to intervene with Priya Students in a targeted approach to address their struggle with basic reading, basic math and writing skills. This exercise was jointly done with the Govt. Teachers and Balmitras across all the project schools. 2338 students of Std. 1 to 4 and 2168 students of Std. 5 to 8 across all the project schools benefited.

The VaGaLe assessment result showed that 50% Priya students of Std. 1 to 4 scored marks in the range of 1 to 10 while 19.4% students scored marks in the range of 16 to 20. On the other hand, 51.11% of Std. 5 to 8 scored marks in the range of 1 to 10 and 18.36% scored between 16 to 20. The learning journey is going on.

School on Wheel (SoW) interventions are appreciated by all the Govt. Officials, Govt. Teachers, Students and village communities. The Math and Science exercises conducted through SoW were received very enthusiastically by the students and teachers. It has increased students' interest on the subjects. Various science and Math photo exhibitions, the Telescope shows (Planet Mars, constellation and Pole star) at school and evening film screening at community levels is a great success.

The co-curricular activities helped children building on their creative skills and contributed in enhancing their confidence. Activities like memory games and creating stories with the help of picture cards helped them enhancing their cognitive skills especially focused attention, remember and recall, visual processing, auditory processing and to some extent logic and reasoning. Anusandhan, partner organization of Jeevantirth took responsibility to develop teaching-learning material for co-curricular activities.





TATA CSR PROJECT

The purpose of education is to develop each student to his or her fullest potential. You can not restrict the process of education within the four walls of a school, and academic subjects can also be taught and reinforced through co-curricular activities. 'Co-curricular activities' refer to those activities which complement learning experience of the students in the schools. These activities are connected with academic and are organized or designed to help the students have a better understanding of her/his course. Thus Co-curricular activities may be undertaken to strengthen the classroom learning.

Under CSR Project of TATA Motors, Jeevantirth selected 20 schools in Sanand to cover 5,000 Students under the project. Every month 2 activities for Lower Primary and 2 activities for Upper Primary were planed. Educational Volunteers visited and facilitated activities twice a month in each school, activities were designed in such a way that each student of the school could take part in the activities in one or the other way.





DEVELOPMENT OF VOCATIONAL SKILLS AND LIFE-SKILLS THAT ENSURES EMPLOYMENT

Poddar Tyres and Jeevantirth joined their hands to implement an Employability Training Program under the CSR of Poddar Tyres. The purpose of this program was to give employable skill training in Retail Marketing, Domestic BPO, Tally and Beauty Parlor & Well Being.

Training and placement was done of unprivileged candidates who are School or College drop outs youths under the age of 18 to 35 years. Jeevantirth has been running vocational training for last 5 years. We already had Vocational Training Centre at Wadaj. Having gained experience, expertise and knowledge, in addition to our centre in Vadaj we expanded our operations in the Naroda, Odhav, Gomtipur (Industrial Areas) of Ahmadabad. It was noted that though it is industrial zone it lacks institutions which impart proper holistic skill development training program. It was decided to run the training at two training centre in Wadaj (Beauty Parlor) and Odhav (Retail Marketing, Domestic BPO & Tally)

We launched our first batch on 15th August 2018 at Odhav.

We are confident to achieve the target of 150 Students by 15th July 2019

Our Women SHGs run "Aapni Dukan" which on regular bases gives groceries like Wheat, Rice, Oil or Dal at fair prices with easy installments. Members also purchased home appliances and furniture like Home Floor Mills (35), Gas Kits (295), Sewing Machines (52), Steel Cupboards (26), Peti Palang (12) and 7,500 Sanitary Napkins also.

HELPING RAG-PICKERS WOMEN TO HELP THEMSELVES

What is next for Self Help Group movement in India?

Currently, SHGs are, or at least perceived as micro-finance units which mainly does savings and credit for the bottom of pyramid. The Panchsutra of NRLM which SHGs have to comply with are: regular meeting, regular savings, regular internal lending, regular repayment and regular bookkeeping. This connotes SHGs are community based informal micro-finance institutions. The challenge before us is this.

Can we transform SHGs as business units?
Can we Use SHG Network for delivering Government services?

According to the WHO, Healthy aging is defined as "the process of developing and maintaining the functional ability that enables well-being in older age". Healthy aging also impacts Quality of Life - a term, which needs to go hand in hand with longevity. Strictly speaking, currently the life expectancy in the urban population stands at around 71 years and rural population at 66 years (SRS, UNDP report). To solve the problems of elder people we need to begin with awareness and acceptance, as a first step. Awareness, about the spectrum of challenges that are faced by the elderly today and acceptance, that the family alone cannot solve these. It takes an entire eco system to ensure that an old person is well looked after and their emotional, psychological, social, financial & physical needs are taken care off.

Jeevantirth is taking care in a humble way of the urban and tribal elderly people through two programs - "Nirant Vruddha Mandal" and "Matru-Pitru Devo Bhava". Sparsh is generously taking care of Nutritional part of the MPDB project in 20 villages of Dediapada.

FOR ENHANCING HAPPINESS

Under the guidance of our Kamlesh Sir, Lok Seva Kendra youth volunteers cater many different needs of the community. They help and guide in getting Aadhar Card, PAN Card, Widow's Pension, Opening Jan Dhan & Pension Accounts etc. Through the efforts of LSK needy people got 50 wheel-chairs and 15 tricycles. 120 needy families get ration support every month. 45 TB Patients also get proper advice and nutritional support with the support of our well-wisher Ms. Deepti Shah. Quarterly meetings of 'Aavas Adhikar Zumbesh' – Housing Rights Movement are facilitated by LSK to protect rights of the slum-dwellers.

In the new academic year of 2018-19 Government of Gujarat adopted NCERT textbooks in lower primary section. As a part of Suzuki CSR Project "Quality Education for All" also we designed and developed many teaching learning materials. For the same project we developed modules and material for 'School on Wheels'. Our partner organization, 'Anusandhan' took responsibility to develop material for Co-curricular Activities of the Suzuki Project. Anusndhan also made TLM Kit-2 for VaaGaLe Utsav. We also developed different activity sheets for Girl Child Education and Value Education.



In addition to our regular project based trainings, as a support organization we trained the teachers of Ashram Shaalas for Adivasi Sanshodhan Kendra of Gujarat Vidyapith and SwamiNarayan School.





Smokeless chulha construction trainings were conducted in Sakwa, Bogaj, Navagam, Chikda and Kuler villages of Dediapada with the support from SPARSH. More than 100 families benefited.



INCLUSIVE DEVELOPMENT BY PROVIDING HEALTH SERVICE BASED ON TRADITIONAL WISDOM

Aadi Aushadhi Group of Dediapada has made significant progress all these years and we can clearly see positive socio-economical change in the lives of the members. Their children have also started going for higher education. Active members get 1,500 rupees to 2,500 rupees per months through collection and cultivation of minor forest produce and herbal plants. 2 FPOs are formed with 1000 members. There are BMCs in 46 villages. All do remarkable work for forest protection and biodiversity conservation.

In the energy park we demonstrated three-four types of renewable energy systems so that visitors can get practical guidance and start using alternate energy in their daily life. Our focus was mainly on Wind Power & Solar Power.

SANITATION: A WAY OF LIFE! CLEAN VILLAGE, GREEN VILLAGE!

Solid Waste Management (SWM) is one of the key components of Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM). In rural areas, examples of solid waste include wastes from kitchens, gardens, cattle sheds, agriculture, and materials such as metal, paper, plastic, cloth, and so on. They are organic and inorganic materials with no remaining economic value to the owner produced by homes, commercial and industrial establishments. Most household waste in rural areas is organic, with little inorganic material, and is non-toxic. Because of its environment-friendliness, composting is a highly suitable method of waste management in rural areas.

In this light, Jeevantirth compiled and submitted a proposal for starting up a decentralized solid waste management (SWM) initiative in Sankhalpur, Hansalpur and Sitapur villages in Becharaji District, Gujarat to the Maruti Suzuki Foundation. The project will have a two-sided effect: it will improve the local environment and at the same time, offer continuous employment to individuals from socially and economically disadvantaged groups. It was proposed to form a village institution to plan, implement and monitor the project activities to make it more sustainable. The projects will employ about 15 people, among whom 50 percent will come from the village institution. After the project period is over (24 months), the project - including labor and infrastructure will be handed over to the Village Panchayat.





CHANGE YOURSELVES,

Gujarat Ecology Commission took the challenge to explore and experiment Deep Aquifer Recharge Systems in the village ShishaValla near Khedbrahama as a Model Eco-Village Project.

Based on the secondary data and first-hand information collected from the field visits it was decided jointly by the local committee, officials of GEC and functionaries of Jeevantirth to construct time tested and AUDA approved Deep Aquifer Recharge systems at strategic locations.

After the work was accomplished testing of recharge bore-well was also done in coordination with the representatives of GEC and result was quite satisfactory.
