Vinoba Bhave rightly said, “Learning is a basic instinct and you can’t live without learning. Whenever you feel unhappy that is a clear indication that your inner progress has stopped”. Friedrich Nietzsche, a German philosopher also said that “Stagnation is Death!” After undergoing GAP and SALT cohort we resolved to make Jeevantirth as a Learning Organization and started our journey of re-building our institution. ***At an organizational level we have declared main Goal for the year 2020-21 as: “To strengthen the organization so that it can play an effective role towards achieving Global Sustainable Development Goals.”*** We have initiated an extensive ‘Organisational Development Process’ which will be carried out throughout the year and it will be a way of life at organisational level.

BAL SANSKAR KENDRA

Learning to learn, learning to do, learning to be and learning to live together!

Hope for solving the massive social problems associated with urban poverty appears to centre increasingly on improvement in the methods of educating the culturally deprived children of the slums. Educators have long recognized that such children enter school under handicaps not imposed on children of the middle class, that slum children often seem immune to standard instructional programs, and that a relatively large proportion of them quit school early and become misfits and unemployables.

Jeevantirth is running non-formal education centres in different parts of RamaPirNo Tekro and nearby slums for slum children. This initiative is to ensure functional literacy and mathematical ability in children with life-skill education and citizenship training.

In the beginning of the academic session, Bal Sanskar Kendra makes extensive survey of the locality and takes an account of the situation with regard to education. It is important to conduct this survey every year because of the unprecedented trend of migration in urban slums and constant movement of families from one part of the city to another in search of security and livelihood. All Bal Sanskar Kendras started from 10th June 2019.

In the first quarter, all 'Baal Mitras' joined the RTE (Right to Education) campaign. In their respective slum areas they helped the parents to fill the form for admission in private schools of the child who has completed five years. Online form is to be filled with all necessary documents and proofs which is next to impossible for the under-privileged parents by their own.



First Aid & CPR Training Program: The first Aid Training was given by the 'Life Line Foundation', in which BaalMitras were told that how should we treat first in the event of some accident like fire, flood, road accident, etc. All kinds of treatments were explained in detail with practical demonstrations. After that, CPR: Cardio, Pulmonary, Resuscitation practical training was given. In this training our team learned how we can save someone's life by First Aid and CPR.

"Foram school was new to me and in the initial phase girls were shy in responding me. Once rapport building was done they started taking active part in the process and enjoyed sharing their own experiences and aspirations. I noticed that Prachi was getting irritated very often and always fighting on minor issues in the class. I also learnt that she was behaving in the same pattern with family members also. When I asked her to draw during the module 'Let's Draw' she draw a girl with angry face! During 'Self-awareness' module she identified herself with a Lion! When I talked with her mother she said that Prachi's father was also behaving in the same way. I advised Prachi to observe her behaviour, chant 'Aum', do meditation and some visualisation exercises with positive attitude. Slowly she came out of her pattern, started mingling with other girls and became active during the sessions. When I took module on 'Uses and abuses of Mobile' she didn't touch mobile for one week! Her father also got pleasant surprise to see the transformation in her and he himself realised and corrected his behaviour. Prachi brought Gulab Jamun and Salad during 'Samuh Bhojan'. Happy girl in happy family!"

This is one of the real-life stories narrated by one of the facilitator of GCE. We have many such awe-inspiring stories.

VALUE EDUCATION PROGRAM

Try not to become a person of success, but rather try to become a person of value. - Albert Einstein

Value Education Program is now spreading its wings in the other states and languages also! Three day training workshop for the facilitators of VEP was held at Jeevantirth, Juna Koba during May 19 in which 18 participants from Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh and Gujarat co-learned about the basic pedagogy, techniques and content of the VEP. Tushar Yarmal, Program Manager and Sudhir Sudal, COO, NMBT also remained present for all three days and motivated the participants. Now modules of VEP are available in four languages, Gujarati, Hindi, Marathi and English! Under the project we cover 1589 students of 6th to 8th standards in 8 different Gujarati and English medium schools.

Value Education Strategies:

Inculcation of Values in children can be facilitated through Incorporating Values through the Existing Curriculum, Value Inculcation through Cocurricular Activities, Development of Value - Consciousness through Stories, Inculcation of Values through Discussion on Slogans and Inculcation of Values through Games.

Walking an extra mile: Jeevantirth Facilitators Mitesh and Stenly took initiative, met private donors and got support of about Rs. 75,000/- for school books and fees for 27 needy students.



There are many transforming stories because of VEP. Aakash from ND School applied module of VEP, overcome his fear and wants to be a good human being first then perusing professional carrier. On teacher's day three students of MG and St. Kabir schools took value education classes for other students. It was overwhelming to see that 57 parents remained present in Parents' Meeting in Nalanda School to express their interest and pleasure about impact of the program in the lives of their siblings.

In addition to the regular value education classes we also celebrated many days like Children's Day, Women's Day, TB Day, HIV Day, Teachers' Day etc., So that they can increase general knowledge and became aware about that.



Way Forward:

One fine day it was a pleasant surprise that we received a call from Shree Budharani Sir, the compassionate founder trustee of NMBT that lets expand this program horizontally and vertically to many students, we need to work on a big scale for Nation Building by inculcating values in the next generation. We are exploring how we can take this program in lower-primary also.

NATURE EDUCATION PROGRAM

Our aim is to reconnect children to society, work, nature and their own self.

In partnership with The Serenity Library and Botanical Garden Jeevantirth is providing great opportunity to the students to connect themselves with the Mother Nature. This year we extended our outreach by adding new features in the program. Five types of different activities were carried out this year.

- **1. Half or One day Nature Education Camps**
101 batches, 52 schools, 4,989 students (2284 Boys and 2,705 Girls).
- **2. Night Camps**
8 Night Camps, 435 children.
- **3. Nature Club in schools**
12 Schools training to 20 teachers and 60 students on eight themes, activities were carried out at school level for about 600 students by Nature Club Leader Members.
- **4. Teachers' Training**
100 teachers of Lower primary and Upper primary sections were trained on how to do environment education in schools based on National Curriculum Framework and Syllabus.
- **5. Summer Camps**
Two day, three hour fun activities with nature were carried out during vacation period for about 500+ children this year.



Jeevantirth celebrated "World Environment Day – 2019" in partnership with The Serenity Library, Anusandhan and Education Department GoG at The Serenity Library and Botanical Garden with curtain raising event of the 'Nature Education Program 2019-20'. New academic year is just to begin and we are equipping ourselves with few new initiatives also. The Chief Guest of the event was Dr. Sahu, The Director of Kankaria – Zoo and Master Stage Performer was Maitreybhai of Dhingli Ghar. Children arrived the venue at 9 A.M. and enjoyed Nature Trail, Bird Watching, Identification of Tress and learned about life cycle of Butterfly. They also performed Nature Craft activities. After welcome tea and visiting exhibition on importance of tree in our life, working models of rain water harvesting and brief displays of the activities carried out at The Serenity all assembled in the AV Hall.

This year more than 10,000 children were benefited of the half-day, one-day nature education programs.

A Green School is a resource-efficient building one that uses little water, optimizes energy efficiency, minimizes waste-generation, catches and recycles water and provides healthier space for its occupants as compared to a conventional building. With the active support of Education Department we initiated the program of Eco-School in 12 schools this year. Eco Club means an association of the nature lover students which is an active system providing the expertise and information of conservation of environment. The program ran very well and about 500 children became active for environment protection.

This year we also designed Teachers' Training Program also for lower primary and upper-primary teachers, teaching environmental studies. About 200 teachers took part with full dedication and learnt how we can make environmental studies more relevant and useful in daily life.



RIGHT TO EDUCATION

Right to education implies right to quality education.

Objective: *The objective of the program is to provide educational support to the under-privileged children admitted in private schools under the provision of RTE Act, so that they come out from inferiority complex and become active part of the eco-system where they can bring out their best potential.*



How we do? Keeping the objective in our mind we motivate and support the parents to apply in private schools by on-line registration system, visit nearby private schools and offer out help and convenience them the importance of this positive intervention, hire and train the educational facilitators, equip them with pedagogy of learning and provide effective teaching learning materials. They visit twice a week in class 1 and 2 of the school during regular school hours to support them to celebrate childhood and achieve basic learning VaaGaLe (Reading, Writing and Arithmetic) skills first.

What we do? First we kindle the joy of learning by songs, stories, games, 'Mukt-Vastu-Chitra Gappa' (Free - Object - Picture Talk) and loads of pre-learning activities. We develop their letter and number recognition skill by 'Dhwani Chitro' (Sound Pictures) and basic counting skills. Help them to develop better eye and hand coordination by art and craft activities and slowly make them realise that we can draw letters and meaningful words which we speak and de-code them to read again! Our basic 'VaaGaLe Kit' and other TLMs help them to learn fast.



How much we did? This year we worked in nine schools with 415 students. 114 girls and 150 boys in Std. one and 71 girls and 80 boys in Std. two.

Observations & Learnings: Children become fearless and friend when we do fun-based educational activities with them. Peer-learning and experiential learning are most effective learning approaches during the initial years of schooling. Trustees, Principals and other teachers also come and visit our classes to understand the concept, methodology and effective use of TLMs by us.

Challenges: Poor nutritional status, lack of early child education and awareness amongst parents are the biggest obstacles in achieving basic learning outcomes.

Success and Failures: It is heartening to tell that out of 264 students enrolled in first standard we could help 259 students in achieving basic reading-writing and mathematical skill as per their age and standard. We could not do effective supervision. The book on "PravrutiNo Aanand" was introduced late. We could not take the children for outing this year.

QUALITY EDUCATION FOR ALL

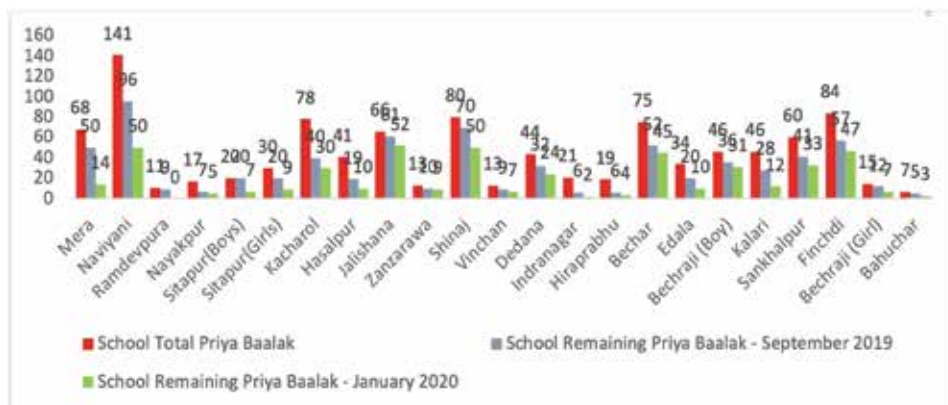
Quality is never an accident; it is always the result of intelligent effort.



Jeevantirth is implementing Quality Education for All project in partnership with Suzuki Motor Gujarat CSR. This project is designed for 5 years and would be covering 5000 children in 24 Government Primary Schools of 18 villages falling under Surendra Nagar, Mehsana and Ahmedabad districts. The project is also aiming to increase awareness among the youth, parents and School Management Committee (SMC) members. The operational base is at Becharji where SUZUKI plant is established. The project got approved in the month of August 2018 and formally launched in all the schools in the month of October 2018.



Jeevantirth and Suzuki Motor Gujarat CSR team extend their gratitude to the District Education Department of Ahmedabad, Mehsana and Surendranagar together with all the BRCs, CRCs, Head Teachers and Teachers of the project schools for accepting and providing all the possible support for all that achieved by QEP so far.



We can see constant positive change because of our sustained effort focusing Priya Baalak. "Priya Baalak" are Students of 6th to 8th Standard that are week in Reading, Writing and Basic Arithmetic Skill as a Learning Skill.



In the first quarter, April to June 2019, we focused upon children's enrolment drive, remedial work with students of class 1 and 2, voter awareness campaign, exams, vacation, new staff recruitment, training and capacity building of Balmitras as well as preparation of lesson plans for the coming academic year 2019 – 2020. Baalmitras, conducted survey on behalf of schools and for this they approached and had various meetings with the Anganwadi centres, Panchayat, BRCs and TPEOs.

During the second quarter, three-day training for academic quality improvement at Koba and Science and Mathematics training at Becharaji were organised. During November a "Bhumikruti Workshop" was organized by the children from the village of Dheduki at the Becharaji office. In which different shapes were taught using 'needle-string'.

The remedial activities (in April and during vacations in May) with class 1 and 2 students enabled them to identify numbers 1 to 100. Count, add and subtract objects up to 1 to 20 and know how to use it in their daily life practices. Targeted students learnt how to do single digit, two-digit and three-digit additions. **Sarva Siksha Abhiyaan (Command and control centre) Gandhinagar appreciated Suzuki Motor Gujarat CSR and Jeevanti's above intervention during vacation.**

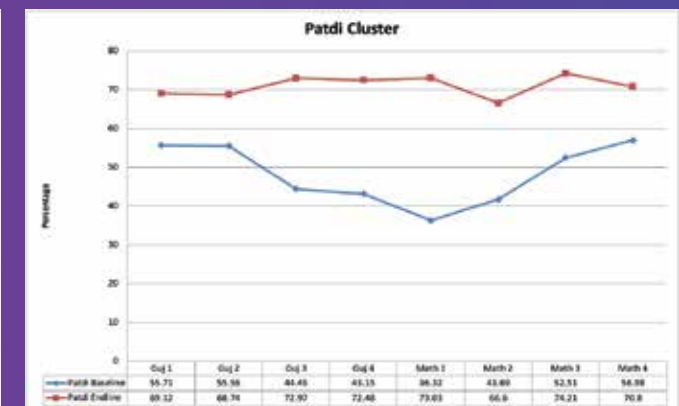
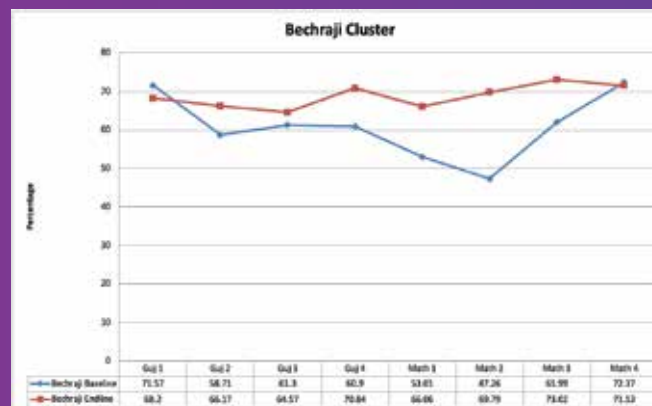
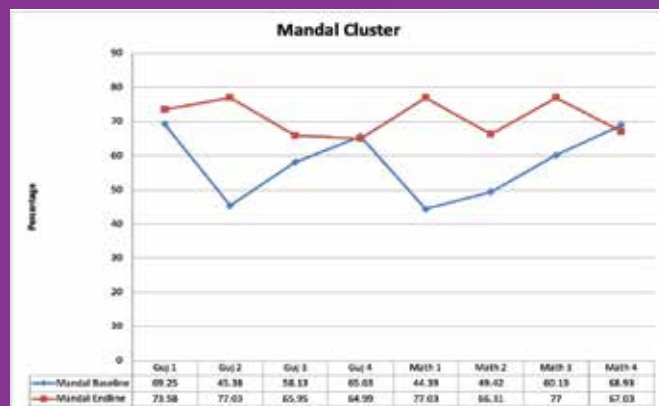


Priya children and irregular children were visited and made aware about education during the third quarter under "Quality Education for All" project. Co-curricular and VaGaLe activities were carried out. During December, Baalmitra carried out activities like children's Songs, Children's Stories, sports, etc. Much attention was given to the development of reading, computing and writing skills of priya children.

VALUE ADDED EDUCATION PROGRAM

Value Added Education adds value to life!

With the generous support of Jewelex foundation and active cooperation from Rotary Club – Palanpur, Value Added Education Project was extended from 10 schools to 20 schools this year. The four goals provide a statement of intent regarding Curriculum, Facilities, Student Enrichment, and School Culture for the project.

Goal 1 (Curriculum): To equip with VaaGaLe Competencies for all levels of students so that they actually learn in the schools!

Goal 2 (Facilities): Ensure educational facilities (Educational Aids & Programs) that are safe, age-appropriate, low-cost, and provide an environment that supports curriculum and activities.

Goal 3 (Student Enrichment): Facilitate and support student enrichment activities for Joyful Learning and Meaningful Education.

Goal 4 (School Culture): Promote and maintain a school culture that has learning environment, where children love to come and enjoy the process of learning.

Each goal of this plan has strategies that will help achieve the goal.

Strategic Plan of the Proposed Project is:

1. To make strong foundation of elementary education by functional literacy and basic mathematical ability by "VaaGaLe Utsav".
2. To create conducive learning environment in schools and community so that actual learning takes place. (To use community as a resource in education).
3. To support and strengthen "Pragyna Abhigam" adopted by the Government in lower primary.
4. To equip teachers by training and material support so that they can deliver the desired results.
5. To work on the Recommendations of State Level Committee on "Gunotsav".



Jewelex Foundation was kind enough to add values to the project by supporting in nutritional requirement and infrastructural support to the schools. The project focuses mainly on VaaGaLe – Reading, Writing and Computing Skills as a learning skill in lower primary. Judicious use of TLM developed by Jeevanti helped a lot in achieving desired results.

WOMEN EMPOWERMENT PROJECT

There is no force more powerful than a woman determined to rise.

Rag-pickers sustain themselves by collecting, sorting and segregating waste and then trading it. In doing so, they help clean up a significant proportion of the 62 million tonnes of waste generated annually in India. Given that rag-picking is a totally informal sector it is hard to quantify how much waste is collected in this manner, but there are rough indicators: Only 75-80% of the waste generated in India is collected by municipal bodies. And more than 90% of India does not have a proper waste disposal system. A lot of garbage clearing thus is done informally, by rag-pickers - mainly women - who work without any job security, salary or dignity. Not just that, they are regularly exposed to cuts, infection, respiratory diseases and tuberculosis apart from poverty, humiliation, harassment, and sexual abuse on the streets. ***The problems faced by rag pickers are multi-fold. Most waste picking activity is technically illegal or unpermitted, so waste pickers commonly face harassment by police and authorities. Also, there is widespread public scorn against waste pickers due to their poverty and perceived lack of hygiene.***

More than 1,500 women - mainly rag-pickers - members of SHGs promoted by Jeevantirth at RamaPirNo Tekro, are saving Rs. 200/- month of their hard earned money to help themselves. Now they have formed Credit Co-operative Society to function in a very systematic way.



Generous support given by Giants International as a revolving fund through 'Jeevantirth Foundation' helps them to run "Aapni Dukan". Regular group meetings and monthly general assembly provides them space to learn and celebrate. We are proud of them for their commitment, politeness and discipline.



We remain in constant contact with the women through Group Meetings. During the year 216 group meetings were held in which 4,320 women participated. Group meetings help in resolving local problems and solidarity is maintained. In addition to the group meetings we held 14 Leader's Meetings also to strengthen SHGs and newly formed Credit Cooperative Society.

URBAN INITIATIVE - Lok Seva Kendra

Serving the people who keep the city life throbbing!

Lok Seva Kendra of Urban initiative provides a platform to compassionate individuals and concern civil society initiatives to reach the unreached for their set of priorities. Jeevantirth "Lok Seva Kendra" provides great many services to the local community in order to strengthen their independence, self-esteem, and ability to participate and contribute to community life.

From May 2019 every Wednesday, Ayurvedic Camps are organised by Department of AYUSH, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India under "**National Ayush Mission**" at Jeevantirth. LSK facilitated Medical Camps, Summer Camp, Screening of film 'Chota Bhim', distribution of Wheel Chairs - Tricycles - Health Kit - Blankets - Spectacles - Ration Kits - Cloths etc. to the needy people.



Nutrition Project for T.B. Patient is being run with the generous support of "**Crayon Foundation**" this year for 70 patients. With active support from Dots Centre, on 10th of every month regular follow-up meetings were held and patients were given Mung, Soybean, Read gram and Nutrition powder. There is remarkable change in the weights and health status because of this initiative.

"Aavas Adhikar Zumbesh" is a network of NGOs working for the housing rights of slum dwellers in Ahmedabad and Jeevantirth is active partner of the network. Jeevantirth is providing space to meet and discuss the future of RamaPirNo Tekro to local community so they can have better deal and play a pivotal role in slum development project which affects their lives.

"Pradhan Mantri Shram Yogi Maandhan" is meant for old age protection and social security of Unorganised Workers (UW) who are mostly engaged as rickshaw pullers, street vendors, mid-day meal workers, head loaders, brick kiln workers, cobblers, rag pickers, domestic workers, washer men, home-based workers, own account workers, agricultural workers, construction workers, beedi workers, handloom workers, leather workers, audio - visual workers or in similar other occupations. 305+ accounts were opened due to our efforts.

VOCATIONAL TRAINING CENTRE

Quality education and employable skills are life-transforming forces.

India is poised to become the world's youngest country by 2020, with an average age of 29 years, accounting for around 28% of the world's workforce. Skill development will be central to sustainable development and a powerful instrument to reduce poverty and inequality.

We are extremely thankful to **"Poddar Tyres"** and **"Jewelex Foundation"** for supporting us to provide training and placement support to school and college drop outs youths of 18 to 35 years old who disparately need employment to be self reliant and support their families. We offered 50 day courses in the Retail marketing, Domestic BPO, Tally GST to about 150 youths and our placement ratio was more than 70%.



Our Success Mantra:

Employability Skills can be defined as the transferable skills needed by an individual to make them 'employable'. Along with good technical understanding and subject knowledge, employers often outline a set of skills that they want from an employee. Employability depends on your knowledge, skills and attitudes, how you use those assets, and how you present them to employers.

At Jeevantirth, in addition to the basic employable skill we give skill sets which are most important to the employer like regularity, punctuality, not going on frequent leaves, good behaviour, basic computer and communication skills, readiness to work and learn etc. Life-skills, value-education and personality development are integral part of our curriculum. This is the success mantra of our Vocational Training Program.

Happy Announcement!

HSBC Skills4Life is a five year INR 100 crore commitment by HSBC India that will focus on employment and entrepreneurship-linked skill development of disadvantaged youth. **For the 2019 grant cycle, HSBC received over 520 applications and after a rigorous process of evaluation, 45 shortlisted applications were presented to the Advisory Committee. The committee has selected 32 NGOs to receive a grant in this cycle. We are happy to announce that Jeevantirth is selected as one of the implementing partner in the program.**

RURAL INITIATIVE

People in the last spot become people at first when we do an about-turn in the right direction!

Farmers' Producer Organisation:

Jeevantirth promoted two FPOs with the initial support from NABARD. About 1,000 farmers are part of the FPOs and trainings on Organic Manuring - JivaMrut, Bio-pesticide were given to them. Saplings of medicinal plants were given to them and now they are cultivating Tulsi, Arduisi, LemonGrass, Dodi, MadhuNasshini etc. in their backyards and farm's fence.

Biodiversity protection:

Protecting biodiversity is a very complex task because most of human's actions has a negative effect on ecosystems by weakening them. For instance, human activities generate pollution that affects living species. Deforestation destroys the habitat of many animals, insects, and plants. Our agriculture favours certain productions neglecting others and leading to the destruction of certain ecosystems. In order to protect biodiversity, it would, therefore, be necessary to change our economic model of consumption to minimize our impact on the natural environment.

Jeevantirth has facilitated formation and strengthening of Village Biodiversity Committees of entire Dediapada Taluka.



Bhaji Competition:

AadiAushadhi Group is organising every year Traditional Bhaji Competition, in which this year members came with the delicious preparation of 86 recipes! Dr. Minubhai Parabia - Former Head, Bio-Sciences Dept., South Gujarat University was the Chief Guest. RFO Ruchi Dave was the judge who gave prizes to the first five winners.



Processing Unit:

AadiAushadhi FPO got Distillation Plant, Shorting-Grading Machine, Packaging Machine, Weighing Scales, 400 Crates and 250 TalPatris of worth 14 Lacks from Narmada District Horticulture department because of the efforts and support of Jeevantirth. This will strengthen the group and help them to add value to their products. Through Horticulture department 5 Day "Value Addition Training" was also held in which President award winner Dharamvir Kamboj gave training of how to prepare various products like Jamun Candy, Dadam Juice and Mouth Freshener, Alovera -Juice -Jelly and Shop etc. with the help of Multi-purpose food processing unit designed by him. District Collector Mr Patel, Gamit Saheb of Horticulture department, DFO ShashiKumar, Shri Smitaben etc. also motivated the participants.





Girl-child Education:

Jeevantirth is running GCE program in five schools of Dediapada taluka so that they continue their higher education after completing 10th and/or 12th standard. About 300 tribal girls are benefitting from this program. We also conduct specially designed modules to make them lifelong learner and be prepared for future challenges in life.

Farmer Producer Organisations:

Collectivization of producers, especially small and marginal farmers, into producer organisations has emerged as one of the most effective pathways to address the many challenges of agriculture but most importantly, improved access to investments, technology and inputs and markets.

Rain Water Harvesting Structures:

Jeevantirth constructed Rain Water harvesting structures in Saladara and Akot Primary Schools as a part of CSR project of Grasim India, Vilayat. Jeevantirth also constructed four Shallow Aquifer Recharge Systems at Bochasan Campus of Gujarat Vidyapith.

Visit of students from University of Michigan:

Under Global Scholars' Program students from University of Michigan came to Netrang-Dediapada to understand the lives of Tribal people of Dediapada. They visited Schools, AKRSP training centre at Netrang and also participated in Training and Moringa (Saragva) Plant distribution sponsored by KVIC, Social Forestry and Horticulture department. KVIC Director Hedge Sir graced the occasion.



Smoke-less Chulha Project:

With the active support of SPARSH Mumbai and Smoke-less Chulha Foundation five day training was organised at Wadva village in which 40 participants learnt the art of improved chulhas which consume less wood, do not create smoke, cook two items together, occupies less space and they are user-friendly. 100 Chulhas are already in operation and we are getting more demand for training from other villages also.

We are on the shoulders of our elders.

Ageing in India is exponentially increasing due to the impressive gains that society has made in terms of increased life expectancy. With the rise in elderly population, the demand for holistic care tends to grow. By 2025, the geriatric population is expected to be 840 million in the developing countries. **Care for the elderly is fast emerging as a critical element of both the public and private concern. The main challenges are: Lack of Infrastructure, Changing Family Structure, Lack of Social Support, Social Inequality, Availability, Accessibility and Affordability of Health Care, Economic Dependency and other social-psychological factors.**

Urban ageing is an emerging domain that deals with the population of older people living in cities. The ageing of society is a positive yet challenging phenomenon, as population ageing and urbanisation are the culmination of successful human development. One could argue whether the city environment is an ideal place for people to grow old and live at an old age compared to rural areas. Overall, the global ageing of urban populations calls for more age-friendly approaches to be implemented in our cities. It is a challenge to prepare for these developments in such a way that both current and future generations of older people can benefit from age-friendly strategies.



We at Jeevantirth run Nirant Vruddha Mandal for the elderly slum dwellers where they find a place to do Satsang, have some refreshment, learn how to cope-up with the aging process in family and society, share their joy and sorrows. Many elders are provided with their basic needs by other like-minded organizations through Jeevantirth. We have active and enlightened elders like Narsinh Bapu and Purshottam Kaka who mentor and guide the elders of the NVM.

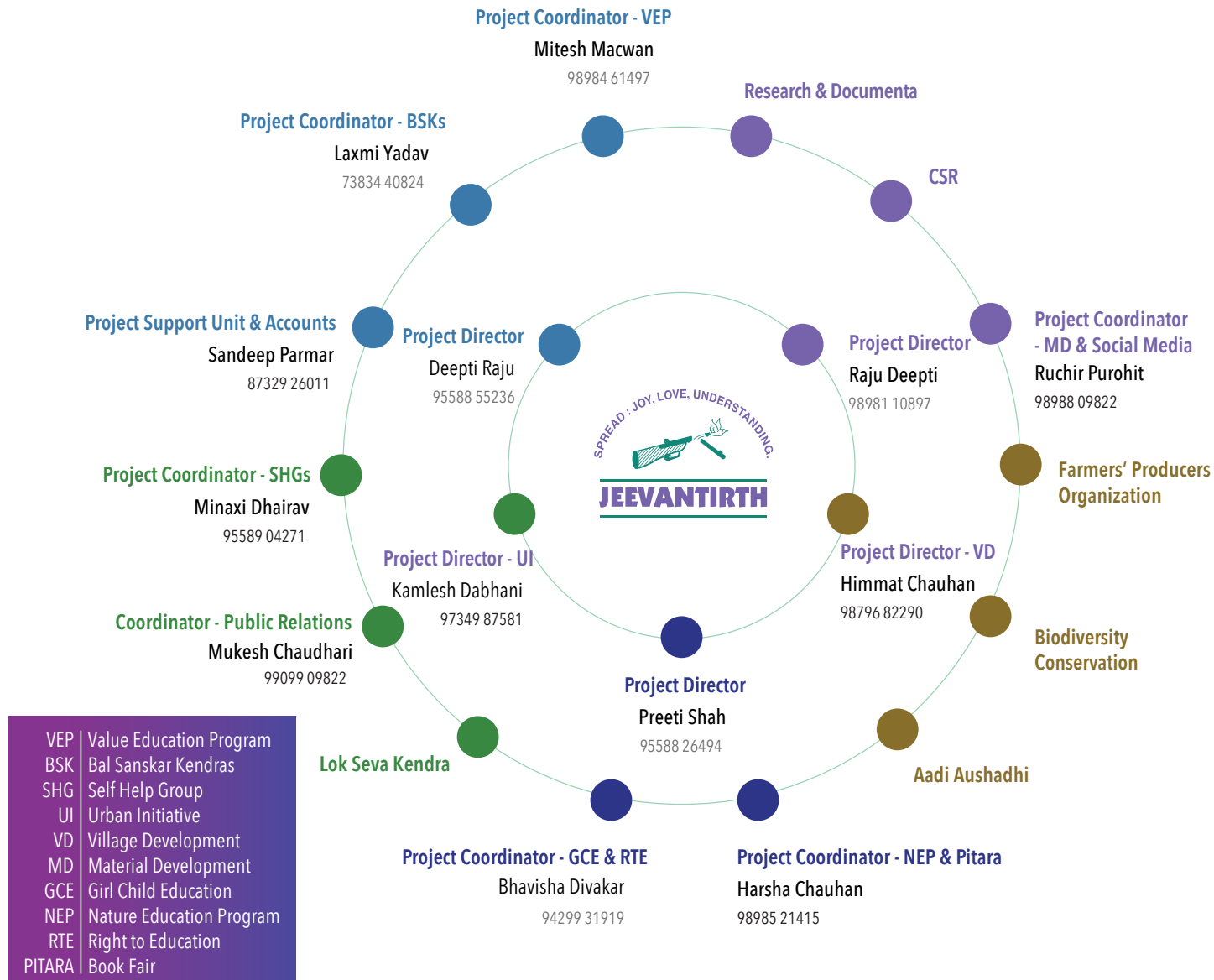


500 elders of 20 villages in Dediapada taluka of Narmada district are benefiting through our "Matru Pitru Devo Bhava" initiative supported by Sparsh and other concerned donors and organizations. A husband-wife team of Sumitra and Sundar are taking care to get them assembled, cook and serve simple but delicious nutritive food and space to interact with each other. Small tours, medical check-ups and some income generating opportunities by planting saplings of medicinal plants etc. are also provided to them.

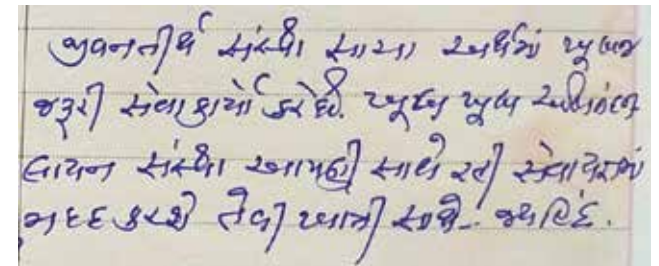

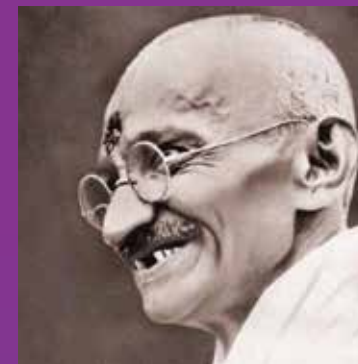
