JEEVANTIRTH COVID-19 RESPONSE

Need of the hour.

As per WHO, "The world is facing an unprecedented challenge with communities and economies everywhere affected by the growing COVID-19 pandemic. The world is coming together to combat the COVID-19 pandemic bringing governments, organizations from across industries and sectors and individuals together to help respond to this global outbreak. The outpouring of global solidarity and support sparked by this shared challenge has been phenomenal."

We at Jeevantirth also took a call, first by spreading awareness among communities and then directly helping the most vulnerable sections of society affected badly by Covid-19 pandemic in our own limited reach. We give brief account of the activities done so far by Jeevantirth with whole humbleness.

1. Door to Door Mass Awareness Campaign in 18 Villages of Becharaji area, 'RamaPirNo Tekro' and nearby slums of Ahmedabad and few villages of Dediapada, district Narmada. We distributed leaflets, put posters at few places and make aware people to wear mask, keep social distancing and importance of hand washing. 15,000 leaflets distributed.







2. Providing **Dry Ration Kits to Migrant Labourers locked up in 30 Night Stay Homes of** Ahmedabad. With the generous support of Nitinbhai Shah & his friends, Deepti Shah and her group Act of Kindness, Asopalav Group and others. 226 Kits of dry ration for 15 days were distributed to 225 families for 1642 Family Members. Special permission was given by director of UCD Centre of Ahmedabad for this purpose.







3. Distribution of about 1300 Dry Ration Kits to Rag Picker Women in 'RamaPirNo Tekro' and surrounding slums of Ahmedabad. Friends of Jeevantirth supported this initiative, special thanks to Brindaben, Giants Group – Lion's Group and others.

4. Emergency Response in Central Gujarat, Nadiad, Tarapur and Vataman Chowkdi: Just two incidents for sample; Ration Kit distribution in Nadiad for Migrant Labourers. Pregnant Women with Kids and family was locked up in court premises desperately needing help. She was even taken to Hospital by our team to avoid complications; she was in final stage to deliver a baby. Another heart touching story is shared by Dilipbhai in which Himmatbhai lifted six hungry and exhausted labourers to Tarapur feed them and gave money to go by bus or train to Uttar Pradesh. Even in this odd situation they were caring pair of pat rabbit with them! We are serving cooked food or food packets to the labourers passing through Tarapur and Vataman Chowkdi.







5. Supporting Camp at Limkheda for Migrant Labourers going to MP and Rajasthan: Limkheda is between Dahod and Godhara where group of teachers and others initiated a camp to serve migrant labourer in systematic way. Jeevantirth actively engaged in and supported in a big way to provide Cooked Food, Food Packets, Water Facility and even Transportation Facility of 50-60 Kilometres to Rajasthan or Madhya Predesh border to the migrant labourers going to home state from Gujarat.





6. Work done by Jeevantirth Lok Sewa Kendra, Ahmedabad for Migrant Workers going their home state on foot or by whatever means they can go. Cooked food, Food Packet, Foot-wares and Mask distribution.





7. Food Packets to Migrant Labourers at Palanpur: Many Migrant Labourers are walking through Palanpur to Abu Road, Rajasthan and our team of Value Added Education are serving Food Packets to them on the way. Though small operation but on regular bases to needy migrant labourers.

Everyone can now support to the response coordinated by Jeevantirth. People and organizations who want to help fight the pandemic and support Jeevantirth can now donate for the Jeevantirth COVID-Response Fund. This is not our core work but we need to respond in crises.

JEEVANTIRTH AS A LEARNING ORGANIZATION

All life is education!

It gives us immense pleasure to present the efforts we have made to put our house in order!

Jeevantirth joined the SALT Cohort: in the first ever five-day residential cohort of the Social Academy of Learning by Toyota from 2nd-7th February, 2020. At an organizational level we declared main Goal for the year 2020-21 as: "To strengthen the organization so that it can play an effective role towards achieving Global Sustainable Development Goals."

After coming from SALT Cohort, a meeting of the core committee of the Jeevantirth was convened to discuss the process and the topics covered during the cohort based on the notes and PPTs available. The OD Process committee was formed and the journey started. The fear of Corona virus was slowly gripping the Nation, we were asked by the authority to shutdown our activities and first lockdown was declared on 24 March 2020.


From 1st April we roll down the rigorous PSP process involving all our team members - about 80 in number!

In two months OD Process, we cover all seven pillars of an organisation namely:

1. Strategy, 2. Governance, 3. Beneficiary Segmentation and Management, 4. Financial Sustainability, 5. People and Capability, 6. Information and Knowledge Management, 7. Quality Management and Improvement.



When we look back the process we feel that still much needs to be done and we will continue this process in coming days. There is always scope of improvement!



JEEVANTIRTH at Joy of Giving - Daan Utsav



Jeevantirth is participating and motivating people to celebrate "Joy of Giving- Daan Utsav" this year from 2nd October to 8th October. Jeevantirth registered itself on virtual Daan Utsav event called Seva Mela 2020 in which about 186 NPO's participated and about 7000+ people visited during the one-day event on 2nd October Gandhi Jayanti Day from 10 AM to 5 PM. 166 People visited Jeevantirth stall which is quite encouraging and satisfying to us.

Jeevantirth also sent about 1500 letters, contacted 1000 people and shared its work on various social media during the "Daan Utsav" campaign.

BAL SANSKAR KENDRA

Learning to learn, learning to do, learning to be and learning to live together!

On March 22, due to Covid -19 across the world, the "JANTA CURFEW" was declared by the Prime Minister of India. Lockdown was required to break the Corona Virus Cycle as directed by the Government of India. After the Lockdown time increased, we asked all the BaalMitras to do different activates at home and asked them to make T.L.M.s using west material in the home. In the initial days, everyone had to work at home for 2 hours. From April 20, time was extended a little and all started getting more inputs to do various activities like Origami, Science experiment and other educational activities. From May 1st to 10th, again time was increased a little and we started doing activity through video, which made the work more enjoyable. We constantly evolved our working pattern and cope up with the ever changing situations. We worked from Home, from Office and on the field in the best interest of our beloved children. We also tried to synchronize with Government's initiatives of online education and education through DD Girnar TV Channel.

Both parents and children were disturbed by the closure of schools. Because of the epidemic, people were reluctant to talk to each other. All had to stay at home all day which made people's days boring and we saw anger and irritation in the nature of people. Some became victims of mental illness. Children were deprived of education. Children living at home showed physical and mental effects on them. Classes began in the areas from 5 September.

Some rules were made for the classes as follows:

- 1. There will be only 10 to 15 children in a class.
- 2. All the children will be seated in the distance.
- 3. All Children must have a mask on their mouths.
- 4. All children wash their hands frequently.

GIRL-CHILD EDUCATION

Trying to fly high and far like a butterfly!

A recent poll conducted by UNICEF shows that the COVID-19 crisis is having a significant impact on the mental health of adolescents and young people in Latin America and the Caribbean, some of the findings are as under.



India is no exception to it. During our conversations with adolescent girls we found that they were greatly concerned about their mental health and future as they lost opportunities to interact with their inner circle friends and spend their time in their own close comfort world. There were more restrictions on their movement and expenditure because of socio-economic impact because of pandemic situations.

Schools were closed for the whole year; it was difficult to find girls on the street, our GCE team did house to house survey, contacted them and invited to come in small groups at different places to interact at least twice a week. The concept of 'Street School' was well accepted by the community and they allowed their teens to come at our centres.








Teenagers are the most misunderstood people on the planet. They are treated like children and expected to act like adults.

During this Pandemic year schools were closed; we explored every opportunity to interact and be with them, so that they get some relief from the trauma and frustration because of Covid Fear and Family Restrictions. During interactions with the girl we found that they were thinking too much about the Covid like, "Why lockdown and so much restrictions What will happen now? Will we die or survive? No work, no income, restriction on pocket money, can't go to school, can't meet friends and chat... what is the hell life has become!" Their minds were constantly engaged with such thoughts. When we met them on streets and in small groups whenever was possible, they were greatly relaxed and thanked us that our parents allow us to come only at Jeevantirth during this time.



VALUE EDUCATION PROGRAM

Try not to become a person of success, but rather try to become a person of value. - Albert Einstein

Researchers have aroued that values refer to goals that serve as quiding principles in people's life. Schwartz distinguished ten distinct basic motivational human value orientations. These values are clustered into four value domains. Self-transcendence (universalism, benevolence) refers to the tendency to transcend self-interest to promote the well-being of others. On the self-enhancement contrary, (power, achievement) refers to the tendency to favour personal interests to the detriment of those of others. Conservation (tradition. conformity, security) consists in favouring stability and preserving traditional practices. Finally, openness to change (hedonism, stimulation, self-direction) is characterized by an orientation towards change and independence.






One study examined the evolution of Schwartz's Basic Human Values during the COVID-19 outbreak, and their relationships with perceived threat, compliance with movement restrictions and social distancing. Results revealed a significant evolution of values: the conservation value was higher during the outbreak than usual. both self-enhancement and and openness-to-change values were lower during the COVID-19 outbreak than usual.

We were all geared up by the motivational message from Budharani Sir who talked with us that you extend this program in more schools and more standards to cover as much students as you can. He was of the opinion that value inculcation in the young minds will make the great nation. Unfortunately Covid Pandemic ruined our plan to extend but our Value Education team without being disheartened found way to run online value education classes with the active support of partner schools.

NATURE EDUCATION PROGRAM

Our aim is to reconnect children to society, work, nature and their own self.

Being with Nature is being with Self, NEP provides an opportunity to thousands of students every year to spend their day in 'The Serenity Library and Botanical Garden' on the way of Bhaat-Koteshwar road. This year because of Covid restrictions, schools were closed and we were not allowed to take 40-50 children in "Aapni Bus" for the Nature Camps. Parents were scared and we also played safe during the lock-down time.

Whenever we find an opportunity, we took the slum children in small groups for Nature Education Camp by following covid protocol. We contacted about 700 parents and convenience them that even for psycho-social well-being of the children such programs are of great importance during covid pandemic. About 755 children participated in 34 one-day camp this year.

Looking to the ground realities we requested The Serenity Trust to help us in running "Harit Sena" for 500 children in the slums. They readily agreed and modules were prepared, tow teacher's trainings were held and we conducted sessions every fortnightly in the slums on following topics.





Themes:

- 1. Identification of Local Trees and Mapping
- 2. Personal and Community Hygiene
- 3. 7 R's of Eco-way of Life: Re-think, Refuse, Reduce, Reuse, Repair or Repurpose, Rot and Recycle
- 4. Animals, Birds and Insects in Cities
- 5. Solar Energy, Making of Cardboard Solar Cooker

We could complete three modules with 578 children. We decided to continue on this line till the situations become normal and we can resume our regular programs like one day/ half day NEP, Night Camps, Teacher's Trainings and School Programs.

RIGHT TO EDUCATION & KALRAV

Right to education implies right to quality education.

Objective: The objective of the program is to provide educational support to the under-privileged children admitted in private schools under the provision of RTE Act, so that they come out from inferiority complex and become active part of the ecosystem where they can bring out their best potential.



While all children are capable of getting the virus that causes COVID-19, they don't become sick as often as adults. Most children have mild symptoms or no symptoms. Research suggests that children younger than ages 10 to 14 are less likely to become infected. But children's lives have been turned upside down by this pandemic. Between remote schooling and play-dates being cancelled, children's routines are anything but routine. Kids also have questions about corona virus, and benefit from age-appropriate answers that don't fuel the flame of anxiety. It also helps to discuss — and role model — things they can control, like hand washing, physical distancing, and other health-promoting behaviours.

Small kids were used to come to our "Kalrav" pre-school classes without much fuss, and we also played safe during the pandemic time. We felt that their behaviour was more responsive and they followed covid protocol of mask wearing, hand washing and physical distancing more vigorously than other age groups!



Every year we encourage and support parents to get admission to their children in nearby private schools under RTE Act. This year, 180 forms were filled by us, in the first round 99 Children and in the second round 28 Children got admission.

RTE classes were not possible because schools were closed but we invited RTE children to our "Street Schools" whenever we could function.

Jeevantirth initiated 'Right to Education' Project in the year 2016 to make avail admission in the reputed nearby private schools to the underprivileged children under RTE Act. Soon we realized that merely giving admission is not enough, we need to support them for main-streaming also as they need to be at par with other students academically. We support RTE children in about 10 schools of the nearby areas.

Admission to the RTE children delayed for the one or the other reason and by long policy and advocacy work ultimately Government initiated the process very late this year. Schools were closed almost whole academic year this time and we also changed our strategy to cope up with the situation. We ran nine 'Street Schools' in eight areas for 157 RTE students.



If we expect our children to thrive at our colleges and universities, and succeed in our economy once they graduate - first we must make quality, affordable early childhood education accessible to all.

QUALITY EDUCATION FOR ALL

Quality is never an accident; it is always the result of intelligent effort.



'Quality Education for All' project has done a remarkable job during Covid Pandemic time. It was a well strategized intervention and a lot of effort was put in by the Suzuki CSR team and Jeevantirth so that we could function well and help the local community and children of the area. The outbreak of Novel coronavirus raised alarm worldwide as the number of people infected and death toll continued to rise. The outbreak was declared a Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC) by the World Health Organization on 30th January 2020. In the first quarter we ran a mass awareness campaign about the basic preventive measures like Mask Wearing, Hand Washing and Physical Distancing.

In the beginning all the BaalMitras worked from home, became acquainted with online platforms to sharpen their knowledge and skills by virtual meetings and activities. In the first quarter whenever it was possible, activities like children's songs and stories, games and puzzles, art and crafts, innovative mathematical and science-based experiments etc. were done and taught by Balmitras.

Day by day it was becoming clear that schools will not open in near the future and Government started from 15th June 2020, 'Home Learning' program through DD Girnar, - an educational channel on TV. Our BaalMitras informed about 1050 parents through phones and house to house visits so that children do not miss this opportunity and can start their education by staying safe at home. Virtual educational program 'Parivaar No Maalo' was also launched by GCERT (A Family Nest Safe and Warmth Program) for parents, teachers and families with the aim of providing psychosocial fitness to the children. Our team motivated the parents and the students to make best use of such online programs.

In the third quarter about 1,350 kits of the Booklet "Joy of Activities", Pencil, Crayon set, Rubber, Sharpener etc. were distributed to the students of 1st and 2nd standards of all the 24 schools so that they can pass their time meaningfully at home and come out of trauma of Covid pandemic.

Last quarter of the year was most hectic as we tried to reach the maximum number of children on daily bases, keeping minimal physical contact and offering a variety of activities. That helped children also to come out of trauma and enjoy their learning. Many new science experiments, (like, Bernoulli's cone, straw pump, lift model, dripping from one bottle to another, compressed paper nailing, simple rain measurement model, surface tension experiment, simple periscope); Science based action toys and Creative Activities (like Model of step dori, observing a needle in a balloon, sliding picture, dancing doll, making water vortex through two bottles, doing kitchen garden, shadow puppet show, lip movement shadow puppet show, The following model, raw mango syrup, boiler rule activity with injection and balloon, balloon gun making, jigsaw puzzle etc.) were introduced to them in addition to activity sheets based on their standards.

We express our gratitude to the local people, leaders, school teachers and principals and local authority for giving full cooperation during this testing time.

Street School

Innovative Educational Experiment in Pandemic time!

5th October is celebrated world over since 1994 in commemoration of the anniversary of the signing of the 1966 ILO / UNESCO recommendation concerning the status of teachers.

The theme for this year's 'World Teachers' Day' is Teachers: Leading in crisis, re-imagining the future. Amid Covid-19, teachers make sure no one is left behind. At Jeevantirth we are working on the concept of 'STREET SCHOOL' during this pandemic time. The concept "Street Becomes School; For Parents and Children" which is hailed by the children, parents, and community in a

great way. We have got immense, love, cooperation, and appreciation.

Initially in the time of corona we are focusing on Psychosocial Care of Children and Parents with Life-Oriented Education.

VALUE ADDED EDUCATION PROGRAM

Value Added Education adds value to life!

JEWELEX

'Value-added' is a term used when discussing how much additional learning, experience or development a school offers beyond the 'average'.

In the pandemic year VAE team members were constantly exploring ways and means to support children in the best possible manner. In normal years also generally in the first quarter of the year we spend considerable time in training and material development related activities. This year we initiated our learning journey under the banner of "Sanstha Vikaas Karyakram" in an intensive manner. For about one and half month daily activity sheets were given related to social action and personal development.

In the month of June we distributed "PravrutiNo Aanand" book and stationery to 1,400 children after giving training to our staff so that they can pass creative learning time at home.

In the month of July BaalMitras contacted about 2,000 households and distributed leaflets about Covid 19 Protocol. In has become now New Normal in our society. BalMitras also carried out awareness about educational programs being telecasted on DD Girnar in the nearby areas surrounding their schools. They also spent time with

children in watching these programs and explaining them about any questions they might have.

Rotary Club, Palanpur is our active partner and we remain in constant touch with them. We initiated a novel program of "Street Schools" at different places so that children can come and play and learn on the streets under direct guidance of our BaalMitras. Shri Yashwantbhai Bachani Rotary Club Palanpur – President, Dr. Jayeshbhai Bavishi and Shri Jayeshbhai Mistry (Rotary Club Members), Shri Hajibhai (Retired professor of Lok Bharti) and others actively participated and appreciated our efforts.

In the last quarter we also introduced 'Saturday Program' in which we organized special activities of introducing new TLMs, BaalGeet, Stories, Traditional Games, etc. so that they understand importance of giving due attention to the children in pandemic time.

Under VAE program we endeavour to offer value-added measures that can be used in schools to offer a fair indication of how far a pupil has come and how well that school has helped to progress that pupil.

WOMEN EMPOWERMENT PROJECT

There is no force more powerful than a woman determined to rise.

There are many stories about the plight of the people during Covid 19 these days and we don't want to add more to it. During strict lock-down our Rag Pickers Women could not go to collect recyclable garbage from the street and were forced to stay at home. Their support was vital to about 7,000 rag picker's families of our area in normal days. With the generous support from our supporters, we were able to supply in them in two rounds; Dry Ration Kits, Masks, Sanitizers, Immunity Medicines etc. to about 1,500 families during the year and make their life bearable.

Women were also facing difficulties in doing their regular savings or returning loans they took for various reasons or instalments of the house-hold grocery or other things they purchased from their SHGs, Cooperative of "Aapni Dukaan". Realising this we also didn't force them to return money and gave more breathing time. Somehow they managed well and there were very few defaulters. We salute their integrity in dealing with their own SHGs.

We are happy to announce that this year, 'Global Fund for Women' supported right based activities of our women self-help groups. Global Fund for Women is a leading funder of gender justice organizations, initiatives and movements worldwide. Because of that support we could increase our outreach in more areas and address many women related issues especially in pandemic time. Keeping covid protocol in place we conducted various workshops on Women's right, gender equality, domestic violence, right to information, right to education, public distribution systems, water & sanitation related issues with women leaders.

Inauguration of 'Saaheli Centre'

October 2nd, 2020.

Urban Initiative of Jeevantirth was initiated 11 years ago on Gandhi Jayanti day with the aim of serving the people who keep city life throbbing. We are working in one of the biggest slum of Gujarat – RamapirNo Tekro and nearby slums since 2008. On this Gandhi Jayanti day, we remembered father of the nation, Mahatma Gandhiji; and Lal Bahadur Shastri, one of the best prime minister India has ever had and celebrated their birthday by inaugurating 'Saaheli Kendra' for the rag-pickers women.

In a small gathering Veenaben Patel, Shobhnaben Shah and Brindaben Vaishnav congratulated the SHG members of rag-pickers women and expressed their solidarity and best wishes to make best use of the centre.

Training on Sanitary Pad Making

Jeevantirth SHGs of Rag-pickers women received a sanitary pad making machine from 'CRIMSON' under 'International Service Project 2019-21' on 2nd October 2020 Gandhi Jayanti Day. 3-day training was given by Mr Shivam in which about 15 SHG members participated. Mukundbhai – our well-wisher – and ambassador came with Dr. Payal and took great interest in observing the process. He gave valuable input also. We are planning to inaugurate the project in near future once everything is set up well. We are thankful to Ladies' Circle India for identifying us for their friendship and service project.

The road to genuine gender equality (along with all the important nuances in between, intersecting with the power dynamics of race, class, sexuality, and more) is a long and constantly shifting one.



URBAN INITIATIVE - Lok Seva Kendra

Serving the people who keep the city life throbbing!

From the day one of the Year 2020-21 the focus of LSK was on how to prevent spread of Covid 19 Pandemic in RamaPirNo Tekro and nearby slums and how to mitigate it's negative effect on the most vulnerable sections of the society. During this testing time our friends and well-wisher organisations came to our help and we thank them all from the deepest of our heart for their wonderful support. We specially thank for the outstanding contributions of Pankajbhai of 'Give for Ever', Giant's Group Main, Brindaben of 'Aatmiya Foundation', 'Our Aashiyana', Virenbhai of 'Manav Sadhana', Shaileshbhai of 'Bhudarbhai Trust' etc. as without their support hardly we could achieve much.

As a livelihood support program, we gave Cabin Shop to Vinodbhai Boria who himself and his wife both are about 80% handicap. We also gave Idli-Dhosa Lari to another beneficiary. We also served cooked food for seven days in the area to the needy families during the complete lockdown to the needy families.









About 2,000 Dry Ration Kits were distributed mainly to the Rag Picker Women's families and other needy families. About 1,000 Migrant Labourers of other states were given Footwear, Hand gloves, Masks, Cooked Food and two days' dry snacks on the way going home on foot during lockdown. With the support form 'RajChandracharya - Dharampur Group' 2,000 Masks and Ayurvedic/Homopathic Medicines were distributed to improve immunity level in the community.

Looking to the Pandemic time this year in our 'School on Wheels' program in the interior villages of Vada, Banaskantha we ran a 'Mass Awareness Campaign' to follow Covid Protocol of Mask wearing, Physical distancing and Hand-washing. We also distributed Kits and Footwear in the area. About 2,000 Masks were prepared by our SHGs women and distributed in the area. 'Crayon Foundation' distributed about 1,000 Masks for the children with beautiful cartoons to our children coming to Baal Sanskar Kendras.

To recognise the outstanding work of the Corona Warriors and boost their morel, we gave Rs. 1,000/- cash and kits, masks and mass awareness leaflets to the linkworkers of the area. During this Pandemic time we also distributed regularly every month Mung, Chana, Soyabin, Milk Powder to about 50 TB Patients.

VOCATIONAL TRAINING CENTRE

Quality education and employable skills are life-transforming forces.

In December 2019, we received HSBC Skills for Life - a visionary project aimed to curb the unemployment prevailing in our country's youth. Our main target was the youths who were socially and economically backward as well as school/college dropouts. We launched our first batch in January, 2020 with the strength of 25 candidates. Initially, everything was going nice. The batch's training was also going smoothly. But then, due to rising covid cases in Gujarat, a state-wide lockdown was enforced in March 2020. We

faced many challenges such as problems in shifting our classes to a digital platform. However, gradually, we and the students adapted this 'new normal'. It was the first wave of covid when we launched another two batches. Batch-2 in July, 2020 difficult for us to bring new students as the public feared getting infected. Moreover, the students of Batch-1, who had recently been placed, started losing their jobs. 'Tally accounting with GST' has good employment potential.







But as it is said, every challenge brings a new lesson and a new success along with it. We also learnt from our mistakes and with some new strategies, we made a good comeback. We again gave jobs to the students who had lost it and we are still placing many. Batch-2 and Batch-3 passed out together in December 2020. The biggest milestone achievement we made was the job placement of these students in pandemic time. We placed these freshers during a situation when even experienced candidates were losing their jobs! It was a huge success for us. We launched our Batch-4 in December, 2020 and 5th batch in February, 2021. Unfortunately again a

second wave of the pandemic hit our nation and again a partial lockdown got enforced.

So far as 'Beauty Parlour & Well-being Course' is concerned In the year 2020-21, 72 girls were trained, 8 are placed in Spa & Beauty Parlours, 18 opened BP Centres at home, 13 are giving home services. 'Sewing Class Course' is also operated from two places: Vadaj and Ranip. 40 Girls / Women were trained; 5 are working professionally, 12 are working from home, others doing family work. Total 23 are having sewing machines of their own.

RURAL INITIATIVE

People in the last spot become people at first when we do an about-turn in the right direction!

The COVID-19 pandemic is the world's worst global crisis since World War II (ILO 2020a). It has affected the economy in general and various spheres such as agriculture, human health, and healthcare in particular. The imposition of lockdown and COVID-19 disturbed the life of tribal and forest dwellers by destroying their livelihood and health. other Tribal and forest-dwelling communities are inevitably getting affected by COVID-19 and the lockdown. The COVID-19 hotspots identified by the government included 19 scheduled districts, while positive cases have been reported from other tribal areas as well. Key Issues Of Tribal Communities during pandemic time are:

1. Lack of healthcare facilities, COVID-19 information and testing kits 2. Food Insecurity, Loss of livelihood and Unemployment 3. Loss of livelihoods from Minor Forest Produce (MFP) and Non Timber Forest Produce (NTFP) 4. Tenurial insecurity and non recognition of forest rights.



"Kotewadia Tribal Families" of Dediapada are most affected in Covid 19 Pandemic time. There are about 350 families in 8-10 remote villages. They are poor of the poorest tribal families, who either do Bamboo Work or take Vasava Tribal Farmers' cattle for grazing to earn their livelihood. We helped them in our modest way by distributing dry ration kits when first wave of Corona was at peak. We also supported elders of our MPDB program in various ways.



In Dediapada, Jeevantirth has formed the fulcrum around which the formation of 46 Biodiversity Management Committees (BMCs) and 46 People's Biodiversity Registers (PBRs) has been completed for the entire Dediapada taluka. By linking with AA, the BMCs now need to put in place plans for conservation of their traditional medicinal resources.

By setting up nurseries which provide planting material and through active assistance to its members for land improvement, for water harvesting and for organic cultivation AA has effectively demonstrated that medicinal plant cultivation can be undertaken by farmers with small land holdings. This ultimately reduces the pressure on the forests.

As part of strengthening the BMC's, Jeevantirth has organised 4 training programs in 4 BMCs of Dediapada taluka on 8, 9, 14 & 15th September 2020.

During the year 2021 about 2.0 lacs saplings will be distributed to 450 members of 12 BMCs of Dediapada under the Project supported by Ministry of Ayush. The BMC members will grow about 15 types of medicinal plants in their field during monsoon. Once it is harvested, the dry materials will be send to Adiauashadhi office.

Many BMC members have suggested that this is very important activity, and it will help them doubling the income. The medicinal plants could be planted in the farm boundaries and there is no additional space required for medicinal plants cultivation.

As a part of preservation of traditional vegetable crops, we have organised a 'Traditional Bhaji' competition at Nivalda BMC, Dediapada. About 50 members from different BMCs have participated in this programs and about 55 different recipes they have presented during the meeting.







New Initiative

We are happy to inform that we have got a project sanctioned by Ministry of AYUSH (Govt of India) for "Supporting Ethnomedicinal Network Linkages in 6 clusters of 12 Biodiversity Management Committees (BMCs) of Dediapada taluka, Narmada District".



NIRANT VRUDDHA MANDAL & MATRU PITRU DEVO BHAVA

We are on the shoulders of our elders.

According to WHO, "COVID-19 is changing older people's daily routines, the care and support they receive, their ability to stay socially connected and how they are perceived. Older people are being challenged by requirements to spend more time at homé, lack of physical contact with other family members, friends **temporary** colleagues, cessation employment and other activities; and anxiety and fear of illness and death - their own and others. It is therefore important that we create opportunities to foster healthy ageing during the pandemic." As an organisation we tried our best to support them through our 'Nirant Vrudh Mandal' and 'Matru Pitru Devo Bhava'.

The COVID-19 pandemic has had an unprecedented effect on the lives of people, irrespective of social demographics. The elderly faces following special challenges:

1. The presence of co-morbid conditions,

2. Social isolation, 3. The issue of access to medications and health facilities and

4. Anxiety and stress. The risk increases for people in their 50s and increases in 60s, 70s, and 80s.





We at Jeevantirth, in response to Covid 19, took some special positive interventions with our "Nirant Vruddha Mandal" for urban slum elders and "Matru Pitru Devo Bhava" Tribal elders of Dediapada. Fortunately there were fewer cases of Corona infection and death due to Covid 19 in our field areas. We provided elders space to get assembled and do Satsang and Bhajans, talk about their health and well-being, took care of their basic requirements like nutritious food and medicines. Dry ration kits, cooked food etc, were provided with the help of our well-wishers and partner organisations.




JEEVANTIRTH AS A CARING & SHARING ORGANISATION:





Re-aligning our Work with Global-Local Context




Quality Education is a big global concern and that is why in Global Sustainable Development Goals 30, it is included as SDG-4. The UN has defined 10 targets and 11 indicators for **SDG 4**. At present we are focusing primarily on Target 4.1: Free primary and secondary education. UN definition: "By 2030, ensure that all girls and boys complete free, equitable and quality primary and secondary education leading to relevant and effective outcomes."

The Delors Report proposed an integrated vision of education based on two key concepts, 'learning throughout life' and the four pillars of learning; to know, to do, to be and to live together. We need to take in to consideration above two key concepts of Delors Report.



The COVID-19 pandemic has greatly affected educational systems worldwide, leading to the near-total closures of schools, universities and colleges. We need to re-assess competencies lost during pandemic time and re-design, restructure our program accordingly.

The new NEP 2020 aims for the universalisation of education from pre-school to secondary level with 100 per cent Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) in school education by 2030 and aims to raise GER in higher education to 50 per cent by 2025. Jeevantirth is closely following steps being taken by the Gol, State Government and other institutions for educational reforms.


