Lok Seva Kendra

Our 'Lok Seva Kendras' work on the line of Common Service Centres (CSC), physical facilities for delivering Government of India e-Services to rural and remote locations where availability of computers and Internet was negligible or mostly absent. They are multiple-services-single-point model for providing facilities for multiple transactions at a single geographical location. Lok Seva Kendras are the access points for delivery of essential public utility services, social welfare schemes, healthcare, financial, education and agriculture services, apart from host of B2C services to citizens in urban slum areas of the city.

In Ahmedabad city, Jeevantirth mainly works in the slum areas in the field of Education, Women Empowerment, Vocational Training but peoples' needs are diverse and there are many philanthropic people and organisations who want to work in different fields. Our LSKs work as a bridge organisation and provide all logistic facilities and most deserving target groups to them so that their services reach to the right people. All these years many genuine organisations have tied up with us for partnership and we cherish doing good work together.

We express our gratitude to Dental Hospital Ahmedabad, Ashirwad Trust, Indian Renal Foundation, District Panchayat Ahmedabad, Dhanvantari Aarogya Rath, Lions' Karnavati Hospital for providing their free services to the beneficiaries.







Pedal rickshaws, 2 auto rickshaws, vegetable carts and two-wheeler were given as a part of livelihood support program under Urban Initiative. Until now 40 pedal rickshaws are given after demonetisation.

With the support from our partner organization Give Forever, 3 cycle rickshaws were given to physically challenged people of the area.

Early Childhood Education

GISELA

It is time to recognize the importance of early child development. The NEP 2020 envisages a five-year foundational stage of education: Three years of ECE and the first two years of primary school. In other words, ECE is now supposed to extend from ages three to eight. It also suggests that there should be continuity between the ECE curriculum and Grade 1 and 2 curricula. Though these proposed changes have a potential to transform early learning in India, a lot will depend on how we actually implement them.

We at Jeevantirth realized this, and we are happy that Gisela Foundation, Netherlands who is supporting our various educational initiatives for under-privileged children also asked us to give more emphasis on ECE. This year we up scaled our ECE program and tried to reach more kids in more systematic way. We are happy that Ms. Devbala Joshi, highly experienced and committed Ex. Child Development Project Officer, took charge of the project and we achieved new heights. We tried to work systematically on all the Domains of Development and 17 Thematic Areas of ECE Curriculum. Training, Material Development, Project Monitoring and Evaluation all went well. This was the highly satisfying project of the year. We want to invest more resources, time and efforts on this project in coming years.





About 21 Trainings of BaalMitras were held during the year and in 11 Kalrav ECE classes 250 children were benefited.



Non-formal Education



Jeevantirth initiated Non Formal Education Program, "BaalSanskaar Kendra" with the aim to give life-time gift of basic 'VaaGaLe' (Foundational Literacy and Numeracy) competencies to the slum children as a Learning Tool. In the beginning of the year 2021-22 there was an outbreak of second wave of the Covid 19 and it was disastrous. We continued to work with all Corona Protocol in the street and our 'Street Schools' went well.

Schools were closed, children and parents were in trauma; and our BaalMitras tried their best as heroes in the global pandemic time. Their courage and compassion helped a lot to the people and children in particular to bear with the situation.

The loss of learning that many children are experiencing is morally unacceptable. And the potential increase of Learning Poverty might have a devastating impact on future productivity, earnings, and well-being for this generation of children and youth, their families, and the world's economies." This generation of students now risks losing \$17 trillion in lifetime earnings in present value, or about 14 percent of today's global GDP, as a result of COVID-19 pandemic-related school closures, according to a new report published today by the World Bank, UNESCO, and UNICEF. The new projection reveals that the impact is more severe than previously thought, and far exceeds the \$10 trillion estimates released in 2020.

Under such circumstances our team reached to 500 children and helped them to celebrate childhood and continue their learning in pandemic time also.







Girl-child Education







As schools were closed during most of the time we changed our strategy and run 'Girl Child Education' and 'Right to Education' Programs in street. Parents were not allowing their teenage girls to go out during pandemic time but they willingly allowed to come in our street schools and they got some freedom.

Value Added Education

JEWELE**X**

Value Added Education Program was initiated in the academic year 2018-19. The Jewelex Group has been at the forefront of CSR activities for the last 50 years even before it was mandated by law, and reaching out to the needy communities & underprivileged sections of society is in the DNA of the Kothari family. In the pandemic years 2020-22, VAE team members were constantly exploring ways and means to support children in the best possible manner.



We initiated a novel program of "Street Schools" at different places so that children can come and play and learn on the streets under direct guidance of our BaalMitras. Shri Yashwantbhai Bachani, Rotary Club Palanpur – President, Dr. Jayeshbhai Bavishi and Shri Jayeshbhai Mistry (Rotary Club Members), Shri Hajibhai (Retired professor of Lok Bharti) and others actively participated and appreciated our efforts.







VaaGaLe Utsav



As a part of GyanDeep Project of AIA Engineering CSR Initiative, Jeevantirth is implementing VaaGaLe Utsav in 11 Government schools of Ahmadabad in Changodar, Nikol and Odhav areas.

The project initiated in January only and we are focused on about 1,000+ children of Standard 3rd and 4th only.







Girl Child Education and Women Skill Development



Adopting an integrated approach to improve the quality of life in the vicinity of its plant at Vagara, District Bharuch, Gujarat; along the lines of UN's Millennium Development Goals, DIC India Limited wanted to focus primarily on SDGs 5: Gender Equality, 4: Quality Education, 8 Decent Work and Economic Growth and 10: Reducing Inequalities. Under this backdrop DIC partnered with Jeevantirth on following three projects. 1. Girl Child Education. 2. Women Skill Development and 3. Providing Ambulance to the PHC.

150 Girls of Government Primary Schools of Saykha, Bhersam and Sachan were covered in the GCE project and results were encouraging. Though we tried our best, the WSD project ran in to bad weather and we could achieve our target to give employment to trained girls due to social fabrics. Ambulance was timely hand-over to PHC.





'Lokarpan' of Ambulance in Republic Day Celebration:

As a CSR Initiative of DIC, we took responsibility to prepare and handover an Ambulance to the Primary Health Centre, Pakhajan in Vagara Taluka of Bharuch. On 26th January 22, Republic Day Celebration. Honorable Minister of State, Food and Civil Supply and Consumer Protection Affairs GoG, Shri Gajendrasinh Udesinh Parmar, accepted the vehicle on behalf of the Government.





Khambhat Community Development Work

"Obispado de la diocesis de calahorra", Spain, is supporting Khambhat Education Project for last three years and we are running Non-Formal Education Centres to support quality education there in ten villages.

UUA is also supporting Community Development Work in Khambhat and our focus is on Gender Equality.

'Saune Sikshan Saru Sikshan' means 'quality education for all' project is a long term, sustainable, need-base and impactful intervention proposed by Jeevantirth in partnership with Suzuki Motor Gujarat Private Limited (SMG) under its CSR Guidelines. The main objective of the project is to provide educational opportunities to the students and to create a learning environment in Government Primary Schools by ensuring facilities that are user friendly, age-appropriate, and provide an environment that supports self-learning, peer learning through activities based learning.

The project aims to cover around 5000 children of 24 schools in 18 selected villages near the vicinity of SMG plant at Hansalpur. The project was initiated from August, 2018.

In QEP there were mainly five major components:

- 1. School Support Program through BaalMitras - Helping Students to achieve Learning Outcomes as per their Age and Standard. Judicial used of TLMs for VaaGaLe was integral part of the program.
- 2. Co-Curricular Activities for Re-enforcement through Revision by Participatory Interactive Games.
- 3. School on Wheels once in a month with specific thematic area of development.
- **4.Teachers Training** and SMC Strengthening.
- 5. Special Focused Intervention like PRIYA Students, SAKSHAM or Foundation Stage Program as per New Educational Policy 2020.









Some of the Major Programs and Achievements:

Work from Home and Work from Office during Covid Lock-down Periods. There was an intensive Collaborative Conscious Learning, Material Development & Lesson Plan activities.

Vaccination Awareness Program: As a result of this effort, an estimated 1954 people the work area showed readiness to get vaccinated out of which approximately 700 to 750 people were registered by Balmitra.

Pandemic Effect Field Study: We conducted brief study on the social, economic and educational impact of the epidemic on human life in our project villages.

Street Schools: With following Corona Protocol we ran 155 "Street Schools" and covered about 4,000 children during school closures.

Kutumbotsav – Family Learning Program: 20 Modules were designed keeping family life in focus and worked on the concept of families learning together.

This year we introduced Foundation Stage Learning Process for Std. 1st and 3rd. as per New Educational Policy 2020 and Saksham – Higher order Mathematical Literacy Skill program for 6th Students.

Active participation in District level Innovation Festival: The fair was organized by GCERT and DIET Mehsana. Teachers of about 1,000 Schools visited and appreciated our efforts.

Anandotsav, Festival of Joy: Joyful, creative learning activities in streets and schools.







Nature Club Activities in Schools: Initiated in 10 Schools with 1,000 Children of Std. 7th & 8th.

Teaching Learning Materials Melas: In three clusters for all schools. Five Sections; Domains of Development, Maths, Language, Science and Patters in School on Wheels. 1,300 students.

Value Education Program

Jeevantirth has been running 'Value Education Program' to inculcate life-values in the students studying in Std. 6 to 8 in 10 different schools in Ahmedabad from last 10 years in collaboration with Naraindas Morbai Budhrani Trust. 2177 students from 10 schools in Ahmedabad city directly and indirectly benefited from value education classes as well as inspirational activities during the academic year 2021-2022 during the Corona epidemic period.





Nature Education Program



Nature Education Camps, Harit Sena - Nature Clubs in Schools

Gujarat's COVID-19 situation was worsening in April 21, with a sharp rise in new infections and mortality as the state was in midst of the second wave of the global pandemic. The worst affected were the major cities — Ahmedabad, Surat, Vadodara and Rajkot — where two-thirds of the State's total cases were coming up. Schools were closed for more than a year and children of underprivileged sections of society were not able to take full advantage of virtual learning through mobile or TV for many reasons. Under these circumstances we initiated the concept of "Street School" and The Serenity Trust and Jeevantirth jointly launched innovative environmental education program called "Harit Sena" – Eco-Clubs in communities. 500 Children were covered under the project and the experience was highly rewarding.

We started assembling and organizing children through some entry-point activities like songs, stories, games and Art & Craft Activities. We worked on the modules, developed and design teaching learning materials in the form of exhibitions, charts, banners, posters, models and activity sheets. We also conducted trainings of educational volunteers at the Serenity Library and Botanical Garden, Jeevantirth Juna Koba and our RamaPirNo Tekro, Vadaj Centre. Once the program was rolled out regular visits were also done to supervise, monitor and giving hand-holding supports to the BaalMitras.

Case Study:

Tejal comes from a middle-class family. "Before I came to Jeevantirth, I was totally free, which I didn't liked. I felt like I'm wasting my time. I wanted to do something or learn something new and that's when a pamphlet came to my house" she remembers. That pamphlet was about Jeevantirth. "After joining Jeevantirth, I built confidence in myself and communication learnt skills as well as behavioral skills too. Another value of Jeevantirth that fascinated me a lot was they always believed in the ethic of always helping others regardless of age, gender, caste, religion or even financial condition." she says. Today she is working as an accountant at a monthly salary of INR 9000. She is very happy now with her 'busy' life. "The word Jeevantirth has inspired me to make my life like a holy shrine welcoming always others". "Thank you so much Jeevantirth and HSBC Swades for making me whatever I am today. Thanks a lot for making me independent," says with a shining face.

Women Empowerment Project

A cooperative is an autonomous association of persons who voluntarily cooperate for mutual, social, economic, and cultural benefit through mutually and owned democratically run enterprise. Cooperatives are based on values like self-help, democracy, equality, equity, and solidarity.

present there are 2.000 +Αt Women SHG Members are associated with our Women Empowerment Project RamaPirNo Tekro. During the year we followed Corona Protocol and avoided big monthly meetings. In small group meetings we covered subjects like Bank Account related Insurance Schemes, RTE JanDhan Yojna, Breast of Cancer, Importance Brest Feeding, Cooking, Art of Cleanliness, Nutritious Food, Schemes related to women. Corona Protocol and diseases like Malaria, Dengue and Chickangunia.

In Aapni Dukaan, we provided glossary like Oil, Wheat, Rice, ToorDaal on easy installments.







Because of Covid 19 Pandemic women were in great trouble, their income receded and they were finding extreme difficulties in repaying the loans in time. We also restricted giving new loans but during the year loan of INR 31,47,000/- was given for different needs like Education. Health, Marriage, Delivery, House repair, Paying debt. Business Social/Religious causes through Jeevantirth Credit Cooperative Society to 104 women. Some loans were critical to them, for example Life saving loan of Rs. 60,000/- was given to Jyotsnaben Parmar for curing Uterus Cancer.



With the support of partner organizations and philanthropic institutions and individuals we organized three medical camps, distributed Dry ration kits, Safai kits and Diwali Sweets. Programs like De-addiction Awareness, Tree Plantation, BabaSaheb Ambedkar Jayanti Rally etc. were also organized.







For last two years "Global Fund for Women" is supporting our 'Urban Women Empowerment Project' in Vatva region of Ahmedabad and FehmidaBanu and her team is conducting various workshops and trainings to empower women of underprivileged sections of society. Body Literacy, Financial Literacy, Legal Literacy, Health & Nutrition, Civic Training, Healthy Relationship, Taking best advantages of Government Policies & Programs etc. are some of the themes on which we work. In the month of January 2022 issue of "Violence against Women" was discussed.

We also got support from UUA to undertake digital literacy session and gender legal trainings with adolescent girls.







AREA PROFILE IN BRIEF

Vatva region is situated on the outskirts of Ahmedabad city limits, with two GIDCs near each other, that houses a plethora of textile processing units. This is an industrial belt. Inhabited by people working in these GIDCs, this area over the years saw a great migrant influx. The area houses a large number of migrants from other Indian states like UP, Bihar etc. who came and settled here in search of work. Post 2002, the poor Muslims found this area to be a safe haven. and thus people migrated in large numbers. In addition, the Sabarmati Riverfront Development project saw another wave of displaced people migrate to this place in 2014-15. The population comprises largely Muslim families. The rest belong to the Rabari, Devipujak and Dalit communities. Most of the people are occupied as daily wage earners such as auto rickshaw drivers, construction workers, garage labour, employment in small hotels etc. Among women, agarbatti rolling (incense sticks), embroidery and sewing, and work as domestic help are common. Children, especially girls, assist their mothers at work or look after younger siblings when parents are out at work.

BMC Strengthening Project supported by Ministry of AYUSH



Jeevantirth had worked as a technical support group for the formation of 46 Biodiversity Management Committees (BMCs) and preparation of 46 People's Biodiversity Registers (PBRs) for the entire Dediapada taluka of Narmada district. Now we are Supporting Ethno-medicinal Network Linkages in 6 clusters of 12 Biodiversity Management Committees (BMCs) with the support of Ministry of AYUSH.

We have selected 4 BMCs for raising nursery of medicinal plants. One BMC member in all the 4 BMCs took up the responsibility managing the nursery. The details of the nurseries are given below. The species grown were based on the demand of the BMC members.

The saplings raised in the nurseries have been distributed to the farmers for planting on their land. The results are very good in the field and the farmers have started harvesting and supplying it to the Adi Aushadhi FPO.







The Farmers FIRST Program



The project 'Farmers FIRST Program' in Dediapada taluka is an unique initiative to support small and marginal Tribal farmers in response to Covid 19 Pandemic and Global Warming; as small and marginal farmers are most vulnerable to climate change due to Global Warming and pandemic like Covid 19. It will also check disparate migration, promote organic farming and protect deforestation. The project is supported by The Serenity Trust.

The main components of the project are:

1. Farm Support Program:
Land Leveling, Stone Removing, Organic

Removing, Organic Manuring, Farm Bunding, Green Hedge Making etc.


- 2. Nutritional Garden: Vegetable Cultivation for Nutritional Support and Marginal immediate income.
- **3. Wadi** Project / Fruit-bearing Trees: For long-term sustainable income.



4. Rain Water Harvesting: Soil and Water Conservation measures to improve ecosystem.

The Mango saplings, vegetable seeds, organic manure, crates and bio-pesticides were provided to 140 members out of whom 100 are from Farmers first project. About 13 training programs on various topics have been conducted and 488 farmers benefited.

Addressing Malnutrition of High Risk Mothers through Mandap Wadi:



With the support of GACL CSR Initiative, Jeevantirth is implementing 75 'Mandap Wadi' (Two tier creeper vegetables program) for High Risk Pregnant and Lactating Women - Mothers in 2 blocks, namely Dediapada and Sagbara of Narmada District.

As a result of our intervention, HB level and weight has been increased in most of the women.

Establishing A Sustainable Value Chain



Under UPL's CSR Narmada Development Initiatives; Jeevantirth is implementing a project, "To increase income of farmers through establishing a sustainable value chain in verticals of Toor (Pigeon Pea) Dal, Maize and Vegetables in 30 villages of Narmada District".

The main project goals are 1. to engage with 3000 farmers in 30 villages in association with 2 Farmer Producer Companies (FPC) namely Adi Aushadhi FPO and Vikas FPO at Dediapada blocks of Narmada District, Gujarat for increasing engagement of beneficiaries in gainful employment in agriculture; 2. To generate awareness, promote beneficial and profitable agricultural practices and advocate for their implementation and 3. To promote & develop business attitude and skills among FPOs and its members through various capacity building modules.

Primary Survey has been conducted in 9 villages for 1026 farmers who grow maize, vegetables, and medicinal plants.

Covid 19 Response: "MANAVTA NO SAAD" - Dry Ration Kit Distribution:



On our special request, The Serenity Trust supported "Kotewadia Tribal Families" of Dediapada in Covid 19 pandemic. There are about 350 families in 8-10 remote villages of Dediapada who were badly affected in Pandemic time. There were also some families who were badly affected by cyclone and having malnourished pregnant & lactating women. Dry Ration Kit Distribution was held at different places in small groups so that Covid Protocol maintained.

We also received grant of \$2,720 from 'International Partners in Mission' for running "Stitching Classes" and providing support of 'Dry Ration Kits to Jat Tribe' as a part of the Covid Response.



Nirant Vrudhh Mandal and Matru-Pitru Devo Bhava

Aging is a natural phenomenon with opportunities and challenges. India has around 8.6%+ older people of total population. Amongst the elderly (60+), females outnumber males. Since the last two years we have included older women also in our "Nirant Vrudhh Mandal" and formed NVMs in other areas also. About 350 elders are taking part in weekly satsangs and we provide them entertaining, educating activities along with frequent health checkups. Increase in longevity and decline of joint family and breakdown in social fabric pushes seniors into loneliness and neglect. In 20 villages of Dediapada we are running "Matru-Pitru Devo Bhava" program for 500 Tribal elders. A healthy life, with physical activity, good diet, avoiding tobacco, alcohol and other habit-forming substances is recommended. Positive attitude and mental wellbeing promotes quality of life in advancing years.

Elderly in India 2021 report was published in August 2021 by the Social Statistics Division National at the Statistical Office Ministry of (NSO). Statistics Program and Implementation. It is the fifth Elderly in India report, the first of which was brought out in the year 2000. The report uses the terms 'senior citizen' and 'elderly' for persons aged 60 or more - in keeping with the Policy for National Older adopted Persons by the government of India in 1999.

The publication consolidates government data on various aspects of the lives of the elderly population in India. In doing so, the report aims to aid the formulation of welfare policies for the elderly, and help mitigate the ill-effects of an aging population on labor force participation, and health and pension expenditures. The 118-page document is divided five into chapters: Schemes Introduction: and Programs of Government of India for the Welfare of Elderly Persons; Population and Vital Statistics; Economic Status: Health and Social Status. Much things to do for our elders!




